Sheffield Local Association of Boy Scouts.

In issuing its First Annual Report, your Committee note with thankfulness, the growth of the Boy Scout Movement in Sheffield. They view with satisfaction the influence of the Association over the lives of a large number of Sheffield boys, and they fully recognise the value of the work of the Scout-masters who give a large amount of time and energy to the training of their Troops, the evidence of which is seen in their smart appearance and their excellent behaviour.

Change of Title.--Your Committee have found it advisable to change the title of the Association from Sheffield and District Boy Scouts Association, into the "SHEFFIELD LOCAL ASSOCIATION OF BOY SCOUTS." This change was necessitated by the Head Association's Redistribution of the West Riding into Districts.

Appointment of District Commissioner.--In December, 1910, Major John H. Leslie, R.A., was appointed District Commissioner for Yorkshire--West Riding--Southern District.

This Officer assisted the local scout movement in many ways before taking up his duties, and in March, 1911, on his recommendation, the Association was completely reorganised. A new set of rules was drawn up, and, as a result of his forethought and energy, an affiliation took place with the Royal Life Saving Society. He also secured a Camp for the Boy Scouts at Dore, which was opened in Whit Week, and he further showed his interest in the movement by organizing and conducting the contingent from Sheffield to His Majesty the King's Rally, at Windsor.

Your Executive wish to record their warmest appreciation of his helpful advice and generous assistance.

Lord Mayor Reception.—We would also express our best thanks to the Lord Mayor, Alderman H. K. Stephenson, J.P., who kindly entertained the Boy Scouts at the Town Hall, an event that was greatly looked forward to and keenly appreciated.

Strength.—At the census taken 30th September, 1910, there were 30 Officers and 420 Scouts on the roll. At the census taken 30th September, 1911, there were 36 Officers, 11 Instructors and 583 Scouts enrolled. In the ranks of the latter there were 15 King's Scouts and 60 Cyclists.

Training Grounds.—By the kind permission of the Lord Mayor, and the Members of the City Council, Route Marching and Drills were held in Endcliffe Woods. Major J. H. Leslie, now the District Commissioner, also kindly lent his own grounds at Dykes Hall, for the same purpose, and as a camping ground for the various Troops of the Association.

Inspections, 1910.—In August, the Boy Scouts were inspected at the Athletic Festival, Owlerton Football Ground, and afterwards a display of Scout work was given, which was very much appreciated.

A Second Inspection of the Troops of the Association was made by Colonel Hobday, at the Wadsley Flower Show, at which the Scouts were complimented upon their smart appearance.

These were especially enjoyed by many of the Troops, indeed it would be impossible to over-estimate their influence and usefulness in training the Scouts.

We are pleased to report that several Troops, including the 7th, 10th, 11th and 14th, possess their own equipment, etc., and can invariably secure the same camp grounds.

We desire to thank the farmers of the district for so kindly allowing the Scouts the use of their fields, and we are glad to think that this privilege has been generally respected.
