## Sheffield Boy Scouts' Second Annual Report.

In submitting the Second Annual Report for your consideration and approval, your Executive Committee beg to point out with gratitude that the Association now numbers 30 Troops against 19 of last year. The sphere of action of the Association has now reached its Northern Western and Southern limits by the formation of Troops at Stocksbridge, Chapeltown and Dronfield. The Troops of the Association are in excellent condition, owing to the time, patience and devotion of the Scoutmasters, who have worked hard for the future welfare of the boys of Sheffield.

A Return of Troops is appended. List A.

Finance.—A statement of the Income and Expenditure is mexed, which sets forth the

We also take this opportunity of specially bringing to your notice the prudent management of the financial affairs of the Association under the supervision of the Honorary Treasurer, who has throughout his term of office asked only for such subscriptions as have been necessary to carry on the requirements of services of the Association.

In the number of Scouts to 1912, there are 24 King's Scouts.

Badges.-The attached list, marked B, shows the number of badges issued during the ten months, November, 1911, to August, 1912; from this will be observed that a large number of (308) Tenderfoot Badges have been issued. This in itself gives an idea of the number of lads who have joined the Association and have commenced that second period of school work which is shown by a glance at such figures as those shown under Ambulance, Cooks, Firemen, Handymans, Leatherworkers, Missioners, Musicians and Naturalists badges.

Your Committee take this opportunity of pointing out that the Sheffield Educational Committee, early this year, at the initiative of the Vice-Chairman and the Inspector of Evening Schools, endeavoured to work out a scheme for Evening Classes to assist Scouts in preparing for proficiency badges. This scheme when complete will be placed before you for consideration.

We also desire to recommend that our best thanks be accorded to the City Educational authorities for their readiness in assisting in any Scout matters when asked to do so.

This return of badges also points to a matter of deeper concern, viz.:—the number of youths who leave the Association on reaching the age of 17 and 18 years. Some attend the Evening Schools, but many, it is feared, leave the control of the Scouting Association at that critical age of 18 and are lost sight of.

Training Grounds.—Your Committee desire to thank his Grace the Duke of Norfolk, K.G., and the City Council for so kindly permitting the Troops to manœuvre over their grounds in Rivelin Valley. We also take this opportunity of thanking the Farmers, residents and all concerned, who have, turing the year, permitted Scouts Troops to camp on their grounds and have thus afforded facilities for excellent out-door work.

Training Quarters.—We are glad to report that many of the Troops through the generosity of the Clergy, Ministers and others have obtained the use of rooms at churches or chapels, schools, &c. To these well-wishers of the movement we offer grateful thanks.

Field Days.—On the 6th July last a Field Day was carried out under the able direction of Major A. B. H. Clerke, R.A. and Lieut. E. H. M. Nicholson, D.S.O., R.N., as chief umpires.

There were upwards of 500 scouts engaged on the parade, and nearly every Troop was represented.

The Association offers to these Officers its best thanks for their services; also to the Farmers for permission to use their grounds.

Inspections of Special Parades.—The First Annual Sports were held, by kind permission, on the Collegiate Cricket Ground, Tinsley, on Saturday, the 14th Sept.

The 3rd Shelfeld (Walkley) Troop turned out in full force to encourage its members who by hard training had made themselves as fit as possible, and in consequence were most successful.

The District Commissioner attended and presented the prizes.

Quarterly Church Parades.—These parades have taken place regularly each quarter and have been well attended.

The services in connection with these were held in the following places of worship on the date stated:

- 31st Dec. 1911. Wicker Congregational Church. The Rev. W. Blackshaw, M.A. B.D., gave the address to the Scouts. The Dist. Scoutmaster, J. W. Marriott, sang the solo. There were 248 Scouts on parade.
- 17th Mar. 1912. Morning Service at St. Mary's Church, Bramall Lane. The Rev. W. J. Cole, M.A. preached the sermon to attentive listeners in a full church. After the service the medal for bravery and the Silver Wolf distinctions referred to under the headings of Medals and Distinctions were presented to the recipients named.
- 9th June, 1912. Glossop Road Baptist Church. The Rev. John Francis Matthews gave an excellent address from the words "Quit yourselves like men."
- 14th Sept. 1912. St. Mark's Church. There was a good muster of Scouts attended this Church Parade. The address was given by given by the Rev. S. T. G. Smith, M.A., Vicar of Walkley.

At all these services the attendances were good, the conduct of all was exemplary, so much so that the Scouts have received invitations to attend these places of worship again.

We take this opportunity of thanking the Clergy and Ministers for their words of instruction and encouragement. We also thank the officials of these places of worship for their ready and courteous assistance.

Camps.—Your Troops have been in camps at Rivelin, Dore, Manor, Little Matlock, Ringinglowe, Rifle Range, Totley, Wharncliffe Crags, Birley Woods, Scarborough and Scotland.

The lads in spite of the inclement weather enjoyed themselves to an extent which must be witnessed to be understood.

Nearly every Troop now possesses equipment for this purpose. Even our less fortunate have (thanks to the forethought of the Hon. Treasurer) received tents, and it is hoped that blankets, water proof sheets, &c. will also be at the disposal of these latter Troops next year.
