SEVENTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following Report for the year 1916-17.

The work is being carried on under considerable difficulties owing to the increasing numbers of Scoutmasters and others who have joined the Army. Special mention may be made of the loss suffered through the late Hon. Secretary, Mr. H. D. Sawtell, joining the Army Ordnance Corps, while Mr. W. B. Hamilton had to resign the position of District Scoutmaster of the Western District owing to leaving the town. Both these gentlemen have been presented with the Thanks Badge by the Association.

All returns are not yet to hand, but those already received show a membership of over 2,300 Scouts and Wolf Cubs, exclusive of Officers. An additional number of Troops are in abeyance, but on the other hand 8 new Troops have been affiliated, against 6 in the preceding year. Seven Wolf Cub Packs have been affiliated during the year.

The ROLL OF HONOUR is continually growing. The Association have to regret the loss of many Called to Higher Service. Mention may be made of Major Dust, who had been awarded the M.C. only a short time before his death; Scoutmasters H. B. Gallimore and Tyzack, and Assistant Scoutmasters Devenish, Gapes, Fawkes, and Round. It is with pride we note the award of the Military Medal to Corporal Gunnell, of the 3rd (Walkley) Troop.

The Badge Committee is continuing its efforts to raise the standard of uniformity and efficiency for all Badges. They have recently insisted that Wolf Cubs be examined for the Second Star by independent Examiners, and are preparing a list of approved Examiners similar to that for Scout Badges. The meetings are now held at West Bar Fire Station, for which thanks are due to Col. Hall-Dalwood and Supt. Hadwick.

The Proficiency Badges include the Firemen's Badge, and the Association is again deeply indebted to Supt. F. W. Hadwick for the training he gives to the boys.

During the year prizes amounting to £5 annually have been instituted for the Troops gaining the highest number of King's and First Class Scouts, four points being counted for the former and one for the latter. The first place has been obtained by the 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop, who, besides obtaining the first prize, will hold the Challenge Trophy for a year. The second and third prizes were won by the 46th and 29th Troops respectively.

The Examination Committee held nine meetings. Recommendations were made to the Executive Committee for the issue of 10 Scoutmasters' Warrants, 21 Assistant Scoutmasters' Warrants, 1 Cubmaster's Warrant, and 2 Instructors' Warrants.

Last year the country was deeply moved by the story of the bravery of Scout Jack Cornwell. The Chief Scout inaugurated a scheme for a Memorial, to take the form of Scholarships for boys who must be "Cornwell" Scouts. The Sheffield Association contributed £25 towards this scheme, obtained at a special Church Parade at the Headquarters of the West Riding Volunteers on Sunday, November 12th, 1916. An address was given by the Vice-Chairman, the Rev. V. W. Pearson, about 1,100 being present.

Scouts continue to act as HOSPITAL ORDERLIES. It has been decided that these Orderlies must have held the Tenderfoot Badge for at least twelve months and be approved by D.S.M. Wardle.

SWIMMING.—During the Summer months Scouts Swimming nights have been held at the Heeley, Attercliffe, and Corporation Street Baths. The concluding event was the Gala arranged by the Southern and Western Districts at the Heeley Baths on September 26th, when the Trek Cart presented by Councillor Warlow was won by the 54th (Wadsley Bridge) Troop. The open championship of the Association was won by E. Maw, of the 31st (Hanover) Troop.

The Association was represented in the competition for the Edgar Allen Trophy, but was unsuccessful. It is hoped to be more fortunate next year, as some excellent swimmers were discovered among the boys at the gala already mentioned.

The thanks of the Association are due to the Scout Masters, Bath Managers, and many others who have helped at the baths.

CAMPING.—During the Summer there have been various outdoor activities with the usual week and week-end camps. In some cases Troops have been able to make themselves useful to Farmers in various classes of work.

FARMING.—In the Spring it was decided to undertake a scheme of co-operative farming, and a special Sub-Committee was formed. The Association guaranteed the sum of £30 towards the expenses, and a similar amount was guaranteed by private individuals. A plot of about 4½ acres was obtained adjacent to the Lodge Moor Hospital, and a crop of potatoes and other vegetables has been raised. The scheme is yielding satisfactory results except that the interest taken in it was not so general as originally hoped for, partly no doubt because the ground was too far away to be readily accessible to many of the Troops. It has been decided not to repeat this scheme, but to encourage the cultivation of plots in the different districts.

SENIOR SCOUTS.—It is hoped that during the coming year Troops of Senior Scouts will be formed in accordance with the scheme proposed by Headquarters. It is felt that something of this nature is very desirable in order to keep in touch with youths when they become too old to be regular members of the ordinary Troops.

BELGIAN FETE.—A Fete was organised by the Belgians residing in Sheffield, and was held in the Weston Park on Saturday, July 21st. The Association were asked to assist, and accordingly a large number of Troops paraded under the various District Scout Masters and accompanied the procession from Norfolk Street.

A number of INTER-TROOP CONFERENCES and CHURCH PARADES have been held in the different districts, and greatly assist to bind the individual members more closely to the Association and so to the parent body. It is desirable they should be continued on a still greater scale, and every effort will be made to do so.

DISTRICTS.—The division of Sheffield into districts which was made in the previous year was slightly modified, and the rearrangement of these districts has proved to be of great assistance in carrying on the work of the Association.

BYE-LAWS.—It has been found necessary to slightly modify the Bye-laws adopted in the previous year, in order to define them more clearly, and a special meeting was held in November, 1916, at which the modifications were adopted. Further modification appeared necessary, and the Badge Committee brought forward a proposal to alter Bye-law 11, Section (4). This alteration was approved at the Annual Meeting in October, 1917, and subsequently by Headquarters. The Bye-law now reads:

- (4) No boy may wear Scout uniform until he has passed the Tenderfoot tests and made the Scout Promise.

The Scouts continue to do valuable work on COASTGUARD DUTY, over 60 having gone from Sheffield to Dorsetshire alone. The Commissioner for that county has been so well pleased that he has recently asked for more Sheffield Scouts.

ANNUAL MEETING.—The Lord Mayor honoured the Association by taking the chair at the Annual Meeting on the 17th October, 1917, and thanked it on behalf of the City for its work among boys.

The thanks of the Association are due to the Sheffield Education Committee for the use of the offices in Leopold Street for the monthly meetings of the Executive Committee, and also to the Editors of the Sheffield weekly papers, who have kindly continued to publish the Association orders and notes.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING A TROOP.

A Troop is usually connected with an institution or place of worship, or supported by a committee. Although Scoutmasters receive their Warrants from the Association, it is desirable that they be recommended by the body responsible for the continuance of the Troop. Troops attached to places of worship usually ask that a member of the clergy be appointed chaplain.

The first essential is a suitable Scoutmaster. To ensure that he is in complete sympathy with the movement, whoever is selected should carefully read Sir Robert Baden-Powell's book, "Scouting for Boys," obtainable from any bookseller, which is the handbook of the Association. "Scout Tests and how to pass them" and the "Gazette" (2d. monthly) are also useful.

An Assistant Scoutmaster is absolutely necessary to ensure continuity. Scoutmasters should therefore ask these friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Suitable Headquarters are essential, and should be a room or rooms belonging as much as possible to the Troop, which the Scouts can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

When these essentials are assured, and it is decided to form a Troop, the Scoutmaster should, if possible, call upon the District Scoutmaster or the Hon. Secretary. He will then be given the affiliation forms and a folder with the rules, etc.

It is best to start with only eight or ten boys, carefully chosen. When they have been trained for three or four months and found reliable, the best can be made Patrol Leaders and Seconds, other boys being admitted to the Troop and put under these Leaders. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found after a few months there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

When the Scoutmaster has got the organisation on a sound basis, he should inform the Hon. Secretary, who will arrange for a member of the Executive to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night. According to the Rules all the Patrol Leaders should be well up to Tenderfoot standard. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After an election an affiliation fee of 2s. 6d. and an annual subscription of 2s. 6d. must be paid.

Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Hon. Secretary, to prevent duplication.
