### EIGHTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following Report for the year 1917-18.

Increasing numbers of Scoutmasters and others are joining the Forces, rendering it still more difficult to continue the work of the Association, but the prospects are distinctly better, and there is every reason to hope that with the early signing of peace and the resultant demobilisation, there will soon be a sufficiency of highly competent Scoutmasters to permit of the proper extension of the work of the Association. At the same time it must be recorded that in some cases the Patrol Leaders are carrying on the Troops in the absence of the Officers.

In spite of all difficulties the Association still continues to increase in numbers. Some of the Troops have not yet sent in their Census Forms, but those already received show over 2,300 Scouts and over 800 Wolf Cubs, a total of over 3,100 boys. Four new Troops have been affiliated as compared with eight in the previous year, but six which had been in abeyance have been restarted. Twelve Wolf Cub Packs have been affiliated during the year.

The War still continues to take its toll, and the Association have to regret the loss during the past year, among others, of two Vice-Presidents, Majors E. W. Longden and F. P. Belcher. The Roll of those who have been Called to Higher Service contains 56 names.

The Examination Committee held five meetings. Recommendations were made to the Executive Committee for the issue of 10 Scoutmaster's Warrants, 10 Assistant-Scoutmaster's Warrants, 2 Cubmaster's Warrants, and Instructor's Warrant.

The Badge Committee continues its efforts to raise the standard for all Badges and to secure greater uniformity in the conditions under which they are earned. Thanks are due to the Chief Constable and to Supt. Hadwick for the use of the room at West Bar Fire Station in which the Committee continues to meet. Thanks are also due to Supt. Hadwick for the training he has again given the boys for the Fireman's Badge.

In addition to the above a considerable number of Badges of Rank, Old Scouts and Supporters' Badges have been issued. Many War Service Badges have also been applied for and submitted to Headquarters for approval and issue.

Competitions have been held for various Cups in addition to the special Troop Trophy presented to the Association last year. The results are as follows:—

TROOP TROPHY.—Won by the 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop, the second and third prizes being obtained by the 12th (Ebenezer) and 29th (Montgomery) Troops respectively.

AMBULANCE CUP.—Won by the 2nd (Darnall) Troop, the 92nd (Redcar) Troop being second.

PATHFINDER CUP.—Won by the 45th (Ryegate) Troop, the 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop being second.

LIFE-SAVING CUP.—Won by the 58th (Brightside Mission) Troop, the 56th (Heeley P.M.) Troop being second.

Swimming Cup.—Won by the 56th (Heeley P.M.) Troop, the 58th (Brightside Mission) Troop being second.

Col. Leslie's Allotment Prize.—Won by the 45th (Ryegate) Troop, the 29th (Montgomery) Troop being second.

It is to be regretted that more Troops did not enter for these Competitions, as their main value lies not in the winning of the prize, but in the increased knowledge and stimulation of team work which result from the effort to win. In the Cup Competitions the Troops were represented by teams, a condition being that members of teams must have been bona-fide Scout members of the Troop on and from the 1st April.

Church Parades.—Two Association Church Parades were held. The first was at St. Paul's Church on January 6th, by the invitation of the Rev. Spencer Elliott, whose address was much appreciated. There were 1,160 on parade. The Summer Parade was held in the grounds of Westbrook House on July 7th, the service being conducted by Capt. Cooper, C.F., of the Base Hospital, over 1,000 being present.

CRUISER WEEK.—A special Parade was held on the Saturday of Cruiser Week, when 1,100 Boy Scouts and Wolf Cubs marched through the principal streets of the City.

Scout Film.—On Saturday, June 8th, the Scout Film, "Boy Scouts—Be Prepared," was shown at the Victoria Hall, both in the afternoon and evening, addresses being given by the District Commissioner, Lieut.-Col. Leslie, R.A., and the Rev. J. Haythornthwaite. Many boys asked to join the Association as a direct result.

FLAX HARVEST.—The Sheffield Local Association responded to the appeal for assistance with the Flax Harvest, and for four weeks in July and August supplied all these at the Camp at Holbeach in Lincolnshire, some being there also for a further fortnight. The Commandant was the Rev. J. Haythornthwaite, and Sister Edith Spencer, Scoutmaster of the 1st Sheffield Troop, was Matron. The camp showed the value of such means of bringing the members of different Troops together, and it is hoped that in future years the Sheffield Association may be able to arrange a similar camp.

SWIMMING.—During the Summer months Scouts' Swimming nights have been held at the different Corporation Baths.

The Boy Scouts have this year won the Edgar Allen Swimming Trophy, at the same time lowering the previous record by two seconds. The Association is greatly indebted to Scoutmaster G. W. Parker for the interest he takes in all matters pertaining to Swimming and Life-Saving, in addition to Scouting in general, and also to the Bath Managers and others who have given assistance.

AIR RAID DUTY.—The Scouts continued to render assistance in the different Districts, being specially commended by Supt. Hadwick for the work done as volunteer firemen at Walkley. An entirely new feature was the formation of the Pitsmoor Troop Anti-Aircraft Gun Team.

In April, at the time when all available soldiers were required for Foreign Service, the Pitsmoor Troop were requested by the Military Authorities to supply a number of Scouts to work with a reduced Army Team on the Parkwood Anti-Aircraft Gun Station, and nine boys signed on, seven for work on the gun and two for the searchlight. These Scouts attended three drills per week and soon became proficient in the duties assigned to them, and on May 25th the volunteer detachment was ordered to Spurn Head, along with the regular team, for a shooting trial. The Scouts' Team fired very successfully the 15 rounds allotted to them and were specially commended by the Inspecting Officer. On August 13th the Team went to the East Coast for a further trial, under the supervision of the Inspector General of Artillery, and were mentioned in the General's report to the War Office.

This is the only Scout Volunteer Team in the Northern Command, and their smartness and efficiency were commented on by the Officers present at the two shoots.

ROVERS.—During the past year the Senior Scout scheme has been further developed, the name being changed to "Rovers." The first Rover Troop has been formed in the Central District under Scoutmaster L. G. A. Kuypers, with the name of "The Lord Mayor's Own Troop of Baden-Powell Rovers."

JUVENILE ORGANISATIONS COMMITTEE.—During the year the Executive Committee have been in close touch with the Sheffield Juvenile Organisations Committee, to whom they have submitted a scheme, which, if adopted, should result in a great increase in the influence of the Association in assisting to develop the boys of the City and District into good and efficient citizens.

Annual Meeting.—The Association have again been honoured by the presence of the Lord Mayor of the City in the Chair at the Annual Meeting, which was held on the 16th October, 1918. He spoke in a very appreciative manner of the work of the Association.

The thanks of the Association are again due to the proprietors and Editors of the "Sheffield Weekly News" and the "Sheffield Weekly Independent" for continuing to publish the Scout Notes in their papers. Scoutmasters are reminded that these notes are an official method of communicating matters of Scout interest to them.

### INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING A TROOP.

A Troop is usually connected with an institution or place of worship, or supported by a committee. Although Scoutmasters receive their Warrants from the Association, it is desirable that they be recommended by the body responsible for the continuance of the Troop. Troops attached to places of worship usually ask that a member of the clergy be appointed chaplain.

The first essential is a suitable Scoutmaster. To ensure that he is in complete sympathy with the movement, whoever is selected should carefully read Sir Robert Baden-Powell's book, "Scouting for Boys," obtainable from any bookseller, which is the handbook of the Association. "Scout Tests and how to pass them" and the "Gazette" (2d. monthly) are also useful.

An Assistant Scoutmaster is absolutely necessary to ensure continuity. Scoutmasters should therefore ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Suitable Headquarters are essential, and should be a room or rooms belonging as much as possible to the Troop, which the Scouts can take pride and pleasure in hoping to fit up, etc.

When these essentials are assured, and it is decided to form a Troop, the Scoutmaster should, it possible, call upon the District Scoutmaster or the Hon. Scoutary. He will then be given the affiliation forms and a folder with the rules, etc.

It is best to start with only eight or ten boys, carefully chosen. When they have been trained for three or four months and found reliable, the best can be made Patrol Leaders and Seconds, other boys being admitted to the Troop and put under these Leaders. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found after few months there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

Then the Scoutmaster has got the organisation on a sound by he should inform the Hon. Secretary, who will arrange for member of the Executive to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night. According to the Rules all the Patrol Leaders should be well up to Tenderfoot standard. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election an affiliation fee of 2s. 6d. and an annual subscription of 2s. 6d. must be paid.

Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Hon. Secretary, to prevent duplication.
