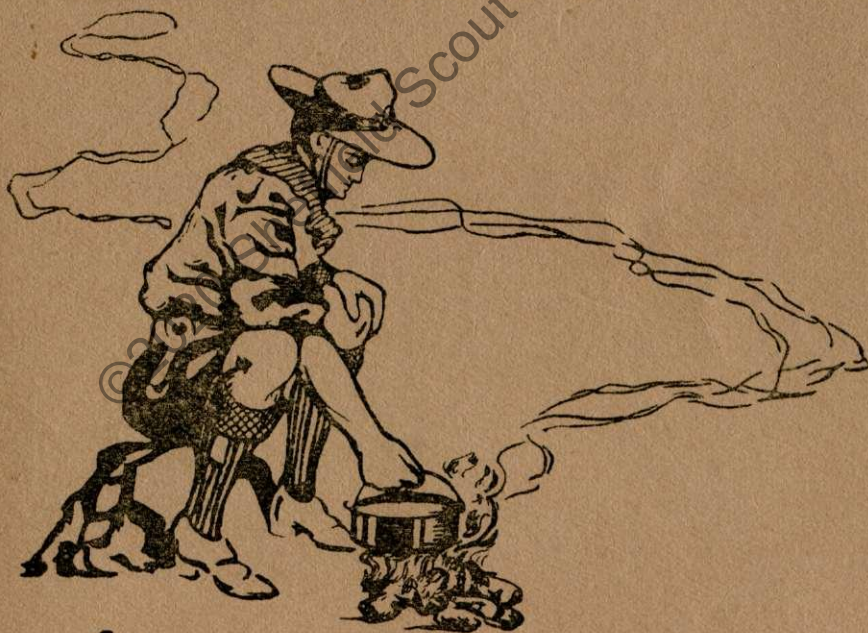

## Sheffield Local Association of Boy Scouts.

### NINTH ANNUAL REPORT.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following Report for the year 1918-19.

During the last few years the Association had been severely handicapped by the large number of Scout Officers and Scouts who had joined His Majesty's Forces, but those days have now happily passed and with the return of the old members on demobilisation the prospects of adequately dealing with the needs of the City are distinctly bright.

A census is at present being taken, the result of which is not yet available, but it is estimated that there are about 3,800 Scouts and Wolf Cubs in the Association, a distinct increase from last year's figure of about 3,200. Eleven new Troops have been affiliated during the year as compared with four in the previous year. Fourteen Wolf Cub Packs have also been affiliated.

**ORGANISING SECRETARY.**—The Committee felt that the proper development of the work of the Association called for a full time Organising Secretary. Thanks largely to the interest and energy of the District Commissioner, Lieut.-Col. J. H. Leslie, R.A., a fund was raised by the "Yorkshire Telegraph and Star" which realised over £624, and enabled the Committee to proceed to fill this post. They feel that they were fortunate in securing the services of Lieut. G. V. Dalby, who had had a long and honourable connection with the movement. Mr. Dalby entered upon his duties at the beginning of April.

Central offices were secured at 6, East Parade, where information can be obtained on questions connected with Scouting, and where there is a room for Scout Officers to meet. All Sub-Committee meetings are held at these offices.

The Examination Sub-Committee held seven meetings, recommendations being made to the Executive Committee for the issue of warrants to 9 Scoutmasters, 23 Assistant Scoutmasters, 7 Cubmasters, 7 Assistant Cubmasters, and 1 Instructor. The Sub-Committee felt that it was desirable to somewhat modify the conditions governing the issue of Warrants to Scout Officers, and drew up a set of local regulations to ensure a certain standard being attained. They also arranged a Scoutmaster's Training Course which was held very successfully during the months of May and June. A similar Course is again being conducted and it is hoped to have several during the year, the object being to give guidance in the management of Troops and in the methods of giving instruction for the various tests. The Association is indebted to a number of gentlemen not connected with the movement in Sheffield, who have kindly consented to give Lectures.

The Badge Sub-Committee have taken further steps to standardise the requirements for the various Badges, having issued a special memorandum in explanation of the First Class Tests and having also secured the services of a number of gentlemen to act as examiners for the Association in the more important Badges. They also amended the conditions under which the Troop Trophy is awarded.

Special mention may be made of the Artist's Badge issued to Patrol Leader W. Sellars, of the 65th (St. Bartholomew's Mission) Troop.

The thanks of the Association are due to Supt. Hadwick for training boys for the Fireman's Badge, to Ex Sergt. Major Whitworth for presenting an Ambulance Shield for the younger Scouts, and to the gentlemen who act as Badge Examiners.



The results of the Competitions held during the year are —

**TROOP TROPHY.**—Won by the 35th (St. Oswald's) Troop, the second and third prizes being obtained by the 3rd (Walkley) and 1st (Croft Hall) Troops respectively.

**AMBULANCE CUP.**—Won by the 58th (Brightside Foundry) Troop. The 84th (Unity Hall) Troop were awarded a special certificate, having lost by one point only.

**JUNIOR AMBULANCE TROPHY.**—Won by the 26th (St. Mark's) Troop, the 58th (Brightside Foundry) Troop being second.

**PATHFINDER CUP.**—Won by the 45th (Ryegate) Troop.

**LIFE-SAVING CUP.**—Won by the 58th (Brightside Foundry) Troop, the 56th (Heeley P.M.) Troop being second.

**SWIMMING CUP.**—Won by the 65th (St. Bartholomew's Mission) Troop, the 56th (Heeley P.M.) Troop being second.

**WOLF CUB TROPHY.**—Won by the 37th (St. Anne's) Pack, the second and third places being taken by the 11th (Pitsmoor) and 3rd (Walkley) Troop respectively.

It is again a matter for regret that more Troops did not enter for these Competitions, and it is hoped that next year a more general interest will be taken in all of them.

**SWIMMING.**—During the summer Scouts' swimming nights have been held at the Attercliffe, Heeley, and Upperthorpe Baths.

An Association Swimming Gala was held at the Attercliffe Baths on Saturday, September 13th, arranged by Scoutmaster G. W. Parker. The finals for the Life-Saving and Swimming Cups were decided, while J. Abbott of the 56th (Heeley P.M.) Troop gained the prize as Champion Scout Swimmer, V. Sellars of the 65th (St. Bartholomew's Mission) Pack winning that as Champion Wolf Cub Swimmer of the Association.

The Boy Scouts have again won the Edgar Allen Swimming Trophy.

**WOLF CUBS.**—The increase in the number of Packs and Wolf Cubs rendered it imperative to give more definite attention to the organisation to deal with them. A special standing Sub-Committee was formed and it was ultimately decided to admit Cub Officers as members of the Association and to add to the Executive Committee a District Cubmaster and a representative Cubmaster, the necessary alterations to the Bye-laws being passed at the July Quarterly Meeting and since approved by Headquarters. To stimulate the interest in this side of the Scout

Movement, a Pack Trophy has been presented by Mr. J. W. Swithinbank for annual competition. The prize for the most efficient Wolf Cub was won by Sixer George Taylor of the 3rd (Walkley) Pack.

There is an urgent need for more Wolf Cub Officers, for while there are 40 registered Packs there are only 17 Warranted Officers, 26 Packs being without a Warranted Cub Officer.

**ROVERS.**—The Rover Movement continues to make headway, due largely to the keenness of Scoutmaster Kuypers, who has arranged a number of special outings such as cycle tours to London and to the Dukeries, and cycle Church Parades to Doncaster, Worksop and Chesterfield. A definite attempt is being made to get back into the movement the former Scouts who have been demobilised. A Rover Den has been secured in the Wicker, and is now being fitted up, and an interesting and instructive programme of work is being arranged for the Winter.

**CHURCH PARADES.**—Two Association Church Parades were held. The Winter Parade was at the Cathedral on December 29th, when a Memorial Service was conducted by the Ven. Archdeacon Gresford Jones, an address being given by the Lord Bishop of Sheffield, Chaplain of the Association. About 1,200 were on Parade. The Summer Parade was held on July 20th, in the Hall of the Teacher's Training College, the service being conducted by the Vice-Chairman of the Association, the Rev. V. W. Pearson. Owing to the inclement weather, the attendance was very poor.

The question of District Church Parades was the subject of considerable discussion, and it was decided that in addition to the two Association Church Parades per annum, there should not be more than one District Church Parade in each District in any quarter.

**VISIT OF THEIR MAJESTIES THE KING AND QUEEN.**—On the occasion of the visit of their Majesties to Sheffield, on May 20th, the Troops of the Association rendered valuable assistance in lining important parts of the Route.

**VICTORY LOAN WEEK.** A special Parade was held on Saturday, July 5th, Troops and Packs marching through the main streets of the City to Norfolk Park, where they were inspected by the Lord Mayor, the Rally being rehearsed.

**RALLY.**—On Saturday, July 26th, about 2,000 Scouts and Wolf Cubs paraded at Barker's Pool and marched to Norfolk Park where they were inspected by Sir John Alcock and Sir Arthur Brown, the first aviators to fly across the Atlantic. The Scouts and Wolf Cubs formed a semi-circle in front of the saluting base,

in columns by half districts, then formed spirals from the rear of the columns, afterwards marching past in single file, returning to their original position in columns. They then retired a distance of about 70 yards before rushing forward in the Scout Rally, which was very effective. On the command of the District Commissioner, the parade squatted to listen to short addresses by the Inspecting Officers, Scoutmaster. L. G. A. Kuypers acted as Rally Manager and there was an ambulance tent and squad, in charge of Honorary Scoutmaster R. Whitworth. The catering for members of the Association was undertaken by Scoutmaster A. Kirk, and the 3rd (Walkley) Troop, assistance being given by a number of Troops, including the 90th (Foresters) Troop, who gave an exhibition of cooking. After the Rally, various displays were given in the arena, interesting individual items outside which were the Indian Encampments of the 1st (Croft Hall) and 16th (Westbourne) Troops, and the camp games of the 6th (St. Luke's) Troop.

VISIT OF THE CHIEF SCOUT.—The Scout year was brought fittingly to a close by the visit of the Chief Scout, Lieut. Gen. Sir. R. S. S. Baden Powell, K.C.B., accompanied by Major Wade, Headquarter's Travelling Organising Secretary, on Wednesday, September 24th, his last visit being at the Master Cutler's Entertainment in 1915. He was met on arrival by the District Commissioner and some of the Officers of the Association, and inspected 400 Wolf Cubs under District Cubmaster Robinson, thereafter proceeding to the Scout Office where he met the members of the Executive Committee.

In the evening an enthusiastic meeting of Scouts was held at the Victoria Hall, the address by the Chief Scout being much appreciated. He presented a number of Cups, etc., special interest attaching to the Silver Cross for Gallantry which had been awarded by Headquarters to Patrol Leader N. V. Howard, King's Scout, of the 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop, for rescuing a child from a fire on Friday, July 25th. An exhibition of Indian Dances was given by the 16th (Westbourne) Troop, and the solo singing of Scoutmaster S. Jepson was much appreciated—the rendering of the unrehearsed choruses by the assembled Scouts being very hearty. A short discussion, initiated by Hon. Scoutmaster D. B. Taylor on "Can Woodcraft be taught to Town Troops" was fittingly summed up by the Chief Scout, who reminded the meeting that some of the finest country in the world was just outside of Sheffield, and he appealed to all to take advantage of it.

ASSISTANCE TO TROOPS.—The Committee have had under consideration the difficulty experienced by many Troops in securing the necessary funds to carry on their work. It is felt

desirable to avoid making grants of money and on the suggestion of Mr. E. Priestman it has been decided to form a committee of ladies with experience in the organisation of sales of work, &c., who will be available to guide those who desire to help themselves. Experience has shown that much more can be done than at present along these lines, and it is hoped that the step now taken will ease the burden under which so many labour.

The Association have to regret the loss of several active members who have left Sheffield, especially Captain E. Morse, who rendered invaluable services almost from the inception of the movement, being Association District Scoutmaster for the past seven years. Scoutmaster W. H. Blake was only on the Executive for about a year, but during that period he took a most active part in the work of the Badge Sub-Committee. Mr. C. D. Inman was on the Executive for an even shorter period but did yeoman service on the Examination and Wolf Cub Sub-Committees. District Scoutmaster W. B. Taylor, who had been a most keen Chairman of the Badge Sub-Committee, remains connected with the Association as an Honorary Scoutmaster, and it is hoped that he will be able to occasionally take part in the work.

The thanks of the Association are specially due to the Proprietors and Editor of the "Yorkshire Telegraph and Star" for their generous assistance in raising the Fund already referred to and to the Proprietors and Editor of the "Sheffield Weekly News" and the "Sheffield Weekly Independent" for continuing to publish the weekly "Scout Notes." Scoutmasters are reminded that these notes are an official medium for communicating to them matters of Scout interest.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING A TROOP.

A Troop is usually connected with an institution or place of worship, or supported by a committee. Although Scoutmasters receive their Warrants from the Association, it is desirable that they be recommended by the body responsible for the continuance of the Troop. Troops attached to places of worship usually ask that a member of the clergy be appointed chaplain.

The first essential is a suitable Scoutmaster. To ensure that he is in complete sympathy with the movement, whoever is selected should carefully read Sir Robert Baden-Powell's book, "Scouting for Boys," obtainable from any bookseller, which is the handbook of the Association. "Scout Tests and how to pass them" and the "Gazette" (2d. monthly) are also useful.

An Assistant Scoutmaster is absolutely necessary to ensure continuity. Scoutmasters should therefore ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Suitable Headquarters are essential, and should be a room or rooms belonging as much as possible to the Troop, which the Scouts can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

It is essential that a Troop Committee be formed for the management of the Troop, Troop finance, and the recommendation for the appointment of a Scoutmaster.

When these essentials are assured, and it is decided to form a Troop, the Scoutmaster should, if possible, call upon the District Scoutmaster or the Org. Secretary. He will then be given the affiliation forms and a folder with the rules, etc.

It is best to start with only eight or ten boys, carefully chosen. When they have been trained for three or four months and found reliable, the best can be made Patrol Leaders and Seconds, other boys being admitted to the Troop and put under these Leaders. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found after a few months there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

When the Scoutmaster has got the organisation on a sound basis, he should inform the Org. Secretary, who will arrange for a member of the Executive to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night. According to the Rules all the Patrol Leaders should be well up to Tenderfoot standard. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election an affiliation fee of 5s. 0d. and an annual subscription of 5s. 0d. must be paid.

Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Org. Secretary, to prevent duplication.
