TENTH ANNUAL REPORT, OCTOBER, 1920.

1. The Executive Committee begs to submit the following report for the year 1919-1920.

2. The report of the past year is that for one of these momentous years "after the War," to which all had been looking forward with such eagerness. It was to be a year of immense opportunities, and your Executive Committee trusts that this report will show that these opportunities have not been wasted.

3. The improvement in the organisation of the Association, aimed at by the appointment of an Organising Secretary, has been very great, and Mr. Dalby through his hard work and skill has again earned the hearty thanks of the Association. The office and the club room have been much used and are an increasing bond of union between the members.

4. (a) The year has been conspicuous for the return of many old members and supporters from the Forces, and for a general re-awakening of the Association as a whole. The growth of the movement is shewn by the affiliation of 14 new troops and 15 new wolf cub packs, and by the rise in total numbers from about 3,800 to about 4,100. A proof too that the Association is no top-heavy structure is the fact that only 3 of the 88 old troops have been disbanded.

The post of District Scoutmaster for Rovers has been inaugurated and is filled by Mr. Kuypers. It is regrettable that Mr. Swithinbank had to relinquish the District Scoutmastership of the Central Division owing to ill health; his work has been ably carried on by Major White, V.C., M.C.

A course of lectures on Scoutmasters' work was given in the Spring; lectures being kindly given by several supporters on appropriate subjects.

During the year 6 Assistant District Commissioners have been appointed to assist the District Commissioner with his work in the Sheffield Association.

(b) BADGES—The quality of the Association can be gauged to some extent by the report of the Badge Sub-Committee, which has worked very hard under the chairmanship of Mr. Stevens, and which shows the following issues:

Special awards have been made by the Chief Scout, of the Silver Cross to Patrol Leader N. V. Howard, of the 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop, and of the gilt cross to Cub Reuben Hunt, of the 7th (Attercliffe) Troop, both for gallantry.

The Association heard with satisfaction of the honour done to its District Commissioner, Colonel J. H. Leslie, who received the Silver Wolf from the Chief Scout.

Although the above list is good, it is needless to say that the Executive would be glad to see a larger number of King's and First Class Scouts. Efforts continue to be made to standardise the work of examination for badges.

The Association is most grateful to the many gentlemen who so kindly act as Badge Examiners.

The growth of the Wolf Cub Section is obvious from the above figures and is a matter for congratulation, since the policy of catching the boy young is admittedly sound. The functions of the Wolf Cub Committee have now been taken over by the monthly meeting of Cub Officers.

ROVERS—The Rover movement for boys over 17, and of which the keynote is "Service," is growing; the Rover is the natural corollary of the Wolf Cub and, as in the latter case, remains in his original troop. The first (Sheffield) Rover Troop has been fortunate in securing excellent headquarters in the Wicker, and has itself undertaken the whole work of re-decoration. The total strength of the Rovers now in the Association is about 100, and these boys are attached to 7 different troops.

SPORTS AND CAMPING.

6. The **SPORTS** Sub-Committee have been most energetic during the year and have been responsible for many activities; of which we may mention first of all the two cross country runs, the first of which was run under very pleasant circumstances, thanks to

the hospitality of our Chaplain, the Bishop of Sheffield, and of Mr. Burrows; the second being run from the headquarters of the 35th Troop.

In boxing there has been a considerable revival owing largely to the advent of the Jamboree, and in this connection we are heavily indebted both to the Y.M.C.A. and to the Comrades of the Great War, for the kind way in which they have put their halls at our disposal.

The swimming for the year has been marked by a gala at the Oughtibridge Ponds, kindly lent by Messrs. Dixon; this gala would have been more successful but for the very cold weather which obtained. On the day following the gala there was a sporting relay race between the 120th (Sheffield Castle) Troop and the 25th Westminster (London) Troop, in which Sheffield was victorious. The Scouts also again won the Edgar Allen Swimming Trophy. The Upperthorpe, Heeley, Attercliffe, and Corporation Street Baths have again been hired on one night a week.

In football our team proved unsuccessful against the Boys' Brigade. Three football leagues for Rovers and Senior Scouts, Scouts, and Cubs, respectively, have been formed and their progress will be watched with interest.

The **NORTHERN DIVISION** held a camping week-end and sports at Wentworth Woodhouse, by the kind permission of our first President, Earl Fitzwilliam; and Lady Fitzwilliam made a special journey from London in order to be present.

The **WESTERN DIVISION** held a combined camp at Bamford. Several troops have camped around Sheffield and also at the seaside, although camping in general has been curtailed owing to the Jamboree.

7. **TWO CHURCH PARADES** were held, one in the winter at St. Philip's Church, and one in the summer in the grounds of the Training College.

SPECIAL EVENTS.

8. (a) The first of the Association enterprises during the year was the **SCOUTCRAFT EXHIBITION** held at the Central Secondary School at the end of 1919. The objects were to advertise the movement in Sheffield and to raise funds; both were achieved to a degree which was somewhat limited owing to the shortness of time allowed for preparation.

(b) "**SUNDAY NEWS TOYS**."—The scouts entered the "Sunday News" Toys Competition and were most successful, the result being that hundreds of toys were sent to the hospitals at Christmas time. The "Sunday News" kindly gave some £20 worth of prizes.

(c) **THE JAMBOREE**—The great enterprise of the year, not only in Sheffield but throughout the Scout World, has been the **INTERNATIONAL JAMBOREE**, held in London during the first week of August. Almost the entire energies of the Association from February until August were concentrated upon this event. The subject was introduced by Major Wade, who paid two visits to Sheffield, one to the Scoutercraft Exhibition in order to choose displays for the Jamboree, and one in February to explain to the Association what was required of it. The work was taken in hand by a special committee under the chairmanship of Mr. Kuypers, and sub-committees were formed for each item; and further the Association was fortunate in being able to enlist the help of first class specialists in Mr. Green for the physical training, Mr. Phipps and his assistants in boxing, Supt. Hadwick and Mr. Whitworth in fire-brigade work and ambulance. Preparations went on steadily throughout the spring and summer and their efficiency was tested by two local Jamborees, which were held during July at the Hillsbro' Barracks by the courtesy of the Colonel and Officers of the East Surrey Regiment.

"Good Turn" days on March 8th and July 10th were organised to enable the scouts themselves to assist in raising funds for the Jamboree.

The Association also had the energetic co-operation of the District Commissioner, Colonel Leslie, who most kindly undertook all necessary arrangements in London, including the camping and entertainment of the boys. Altogether Sheffield sent to London a total of 420 Rovers, Scouts and Cubs, and 56 Officers all of whom encamped at Lords Cricket Ground, thanks to the hospitality of the M.C.C. The result of this was that,

(1) **THE AMBULANCE DISPLAY**

(2) **THE FIRE BRIGADE DISPLAY**

were each awarded a "Tortoise of Perseverance" (a little wooden souvenir designed by the Chief Scout), and the Chief Scouts' Special Certificate for the best performance illustrating a particular branch of Scouting.

(3) **THE SHEFFIELD TEAMS** were also awarded collectively a Special Prize for Discipline in the Arena.

(4) **THE CARPENTRY, GYPSY CAMP and TAILORING Stalls** were awarded collectively a Special Mention under the Handicrafts Section.

(5) **THE WORLD'S BOXING CHAMPIONSHIP, Chicken III Class**, was won by Scout H. Millward, 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop.

(6) **THE WORLD'S BOXING CHAMPIONSHIP, Elephant III Class**, was won by Scout S. Smith, 11th (Pitsmoor) Troop.

(7) **Diplomas for meritorious Boxing Displays** were awarded to Scout A. Hollingsworth and Scout S. Butcher.

During the Jamboree week, a cricket match was played at Lords, between Sheffield and London Scouts, in which the latter were victorious.

The Jamboree has undoubtedly eclipsed all other activities of the Association during the year, but in spite of this and of some dislocation of troop-work the great results have been worth the cost, for the beneficial effects of this great gathering and contests of Scouts have been world-wide and will be lasting, and Sheffield's share in the work has been worthy.

Prior to the Jamboree the Association had the pleasure of a visit from 25 Jamaica Scouts; and later on from a party of South African Scouts, all of whom had come to England for the great event.

INNOVATIONS.

9. (a) an **EMPLOYMENT BUREAU** was inaugurated during the winter and has found work for all those Scouts and Scoutmasters who have applied to it. The number of applications has been small which is an indication that there is little unemployment amongst Scouts.

(b) **THE LADIES' SEWING PARTIES** have been held every Wednesday with excellent results, no less than 100 pairs of shorts and 50 shirts have been made and sold, and 20 boys have made their own. Mrs. Singleton and the ladies of her party are to be congratulated upon their untiring work and also upon the results of their exhibition at the Jamboree.

(c) **THE TRAMWAYS DEPARTMENT** have generously granted to the Scouts and to other juvenile organisations, the privilege of travelling half-fare in uniform. This privilege is much appreciated.

The Association wishes once more to take the opportunity of thanking all those who so kindly give it their support; the Proprietors and Editors of the "Sheffield Telegraph," the "Star," and the "Weekly News," and of the "Weekly Independent," who so kindly publish our weekly notes, and whom we feel are always ready to help our endeavours; the various firms who give their hospitality and assistance of every sort; and the numberless private individuals without whose help and encouragement it would be so difficult to carry on.

INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING A TROOP.

A Troop is usually connected with an institution or place of worship, and supported by a committee. Although Scoutmasters receive their Warrants from the Association, it is desirable that they be recommended by the body responsible for the continuance of the Troop. Troops attached to places of worship usually ask that a member of the clergy be appointed chaplain.

The first essential is a suitable Scoutmaster. To ensure that he is in complete sympathy with the movement, whoever is selected should carefully read Sir Robert Baden-Powell's book "Scouting for Boys," obtainable from any bookseller, which is the handbook of the Association. "Scout Tests and how to pass them," and the "Gazette" (3d. monthly) are also useful.

An Assistant Scoutmaster is absolutely necessary to ensure continuity. Scoutmasters should therefore ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Suitable Headquarters are essential, and should be a room or rooms belonging as much as possible to the Troop, which the Scouts can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

It is essential that a Troop Committee be formed for the management of the Troop, Troop finance, and the recommendation for the appointment of a Scoutmaster.

When these essentials are assured, and it is decided to form a Troop, the Scoutmaster should, if possible, call upon the District Scoutmaster or the Organising Secretary. He will then be given the affiliation forms and a folder with the rules, etc.

It is best to start with only eight or ten boys, carefully chosen. When they have been trained for three or four months and found reliable, the best can be made Patrol Leaders and Seconds other boys being admitted to the Troop and put under these Leaders. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found after a few months there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

When the Scoutmaster has got the organisation on a sound basis, he should inform the Organising Secretary, who will arrange for a member of the Executive to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night. According to the rules all the Patrol Leaders should be well up to Tenderfoot standard. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election an affiliation fee of 5s. 0d. and an annual subscription of 5s. 0d. must be paid.

Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Organising Secretary, to prevent duplication.
