# Sheffield Local Association of Boy Scouts.

## ANNUAL REPORT, 1920-21.

The Executive Committee begs to submit the following Report for Year 1920-1921.

Whatever else the past year has shown it has undoubtedly proved the immense strength of the Scout movement in Sheffield. Probably no centre has suffered more from the evil effects of the post-war industrial upheaval, and yet despite all adverse circumstances the Association's numbers have shewn no serious diminution.

It must, however, be remembered that during the year, the Wentworth Association was formed, whereby 6 troops and 3 packs were lost to Sheffield.

The virility of the whole movement may be well judged by the considerable list of innovations and activities, and by the satisfactory support which has been accorded them.

The Annual General Meeting of the Association was held in the Town Hall at the invitation of the Lord Mayor, Councillor S. Roberts, our President, who took the Chair and moved the adoption of the Annual Report. Other speakers were the Master Cutler, Mr. W. Clark, The Director of Education, Mr. Percival Sharp, Colonel J. H. Leslie, R.A., and Dr. Lloyd Storr-Best. A number of Trophies and Diplomas were presented, and the Honorary Officers for 1920-21 elected.

In July, the Association had the honour of welcoming to Sheffield the Chief Scout, who addressed a Parade of Rover Scouts, Scouts and Cubs in Norfolk Park.

### SPORTS.

Three Football Leagues were carried on:—The Leslie League for boys over sixteen, The Harland League for those under sixteen, and The Pearson League for Wolf Cubs. The support given was disappointing.

An Inter-Association match was also held between the Scouts and the Boys' Brigade, on the Niagara Ground, kindly lent by the Sheffield Football Club. The Scouts were victorious after a keenly fought game.

The Annual Swimming Gala was held in September at the Glossop Road Baths. The Lord Mayor of Sheffield, Alderman W. F. Wardley, kindly presided. Much keen competition was witnessed, which probably reached its best in the Inter-Association Squadron Race against Doncaster, when Sheffield won by a touch.

Heeley, Upperthorpe, and Attercliffe Baths were taken for one night per week during the Summer months for the use of Scouts.

The Northern Division held its Annual Gala at Upperthorpe Baths at the end of September, at which, Mr. E. Parker, the Olympic Games Champion, gave an exhibition.

The Western Division held a Divisional Camp in a most picturesque spot at Derwent during the Whitsuntide holiday.

An extremely popular and well-supported feature of the Winter months was the use by the Scouts on Wednesday evenings of the Y.M.C.A. Gymnasium. Thanks are due to the Y.M.C.A. Council for the loan of the Hall and Apparatus, and to Mr. J. J. Phipps for his able and willing supervision.

### INNOVATIONS.

A Practical Course of Training for Scoutmasters was inaugurated during the Summer in the beautiful grounds of Norton Park, which were kindly lent by Colonel B. A. Firth for the purpose. The Association is greatly indebted to Mr. G. V. Dalby who has acted throughout as Officer in charge of the Camp, ably assisted by a number of Instructors.

Much is hoped from the "University Scouts Club" formed as the result of an address by Major A. J. Dane, D.S.O. With keen leadership this club should prove of value in helping to meet the ever increasing demand for Scoutmasters and Assistants.

The Scouts Self-Support Scheme is a development of the "Good Turn." Every member endeavours to render at least four services of value, and promises to make over any profits accruing



to the Chairman of the Scheme, Patrol Leader S. C. Chandler. The Scheme is in its infancy, and no useful report of results can yet be made. The membership has, however, already exceeded three hundred.

### ACTIVITIES.

The following series of Lectures were kindly given, and the thanks of the Association are due to the respective lecturers:—

- On the Jamboree, Lantern Lectures by Mr. G. V. Dalby.
- On Ambulance Work, six Lectures by Dr. Mary Andrews.
- On Map Reading, six Lectures by Mr. L. K. Usherwood.

A Jumble Sale, which realised over £100, was held in December, under the direction of Mr. W. Bashforth, at Glossop Road Drill Hall, and the Association thanks all who by gifts or service helped towards the success of the enterprise: particularly Colonel Middleton for the loan of the Hall and Mr. J. C. Lockwood who acted as Auctioneer on the opening day.

During the year the Chairman visited America, and saw at the various Headquarters of Scouting manifestations of the great interest shewn in the movement in Canada and the United States.

The Annual Dinner, at which were present the Lord Mayor of Sheffield (Ald. W. F. Wardley) and Major A. G. Wade, M.C., Organising Secretary at Imperial Headquarters, was held on November 22nd, and proved a welcome opportunity for the fortunate participants to become better acquainted.

An Association Church Parade was held in November at the Victoria Hall, the address being given by the Rev. G. H. McNeal.

The Rover Scouts' "Good Turn" for 1921 took a very practical form in providing for some 2000 boys from the poorer districts of the City an enjoyable and healthy week-end holiday in Camp at Redmires. Much hard work has been done, and the effort has been much appreciated by those who have come under the "Rovers" paternal care.

Special mention should be made of the work of District Scoutmaster Kuypers, who has earned the goodwill of all Rover Scouts and admiration of other ranks.

The First Sheffield Troop of Rover Scouts has established a Headquarters at 84, The Wicker; all the cleaning, decorating and painting having been undertaken by members of the Troop. A movement is now on foot to make this a Club for all Sheffield Rover Scouts.

Advantage was taken of the fine Summer to hold several inter-divisional field days and numerous Camps.

The "Cubs" held a Church Parade at St. Anne's Church, which is their first effort in this direction. An address was given by the Rev. T. G. Lane.

District Scoutmasters were appointed to each District during the year.

## INSTRUCTIONS FOR STARTING A TROOP.

A Troop is usually connected with an institution or place of worship, and supported by a committee. Although Scoutmasters receive their Warrants from the Association, it is desirable that they be recommended by the body responsible for the continuance of the Troop. Troops attached to places of worship usually ask that a member of the clergy be appointed chaplain.

The first essential is a suitable Scoutmaster. To ensure that he is in complete sympathy with the movement, whosoever is selected should carefully read Sir Robert Baden-Powell's book, "Scouting for Boys," obtainable from any bookseller, which is the handbook of the Association. "Scout Tests and how to pass them," and the "Gazette" (3d. monthly) are also useful.

An Assistant Scoutmaster is absolutely necessary to ensure continuity. Scoutmasters should therefore ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Suitable Headquarters are essential, and should be a room or rooms belonging as much as possible to the Troop, which the Scouts can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

It is essential that a Troop Committee be formed for the management of the Troop, Troop finance, and the recommendation for the appointment of a Scoutmaster.

When these essentials are assured, and it is decided to form a Troop, the Scoutmaster should, if possible, call upon the District Scoutmaster or the Organising Secretary. He will then be given the affiliation forms and a folder with the rules, etc.

It is best to start with only eight or ten boys, carefully chosen. When they have been trained for three or four months and found reliable, the best can be made Patrol Leaders and Seconds, other boys being admitted to the Troop and put under these Leaders. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found after a few months there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

When the Scoutmaster has got the organisation on a sound basis, he should inform the Organising Secretary, who will arrange for a member of the Executive to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night. According to the rules all Patrol Leaders should be well up to Tenderfoot standard. If the visitor is satisfied, the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election an affiliation fee of 5s. od. and an annual subscription of 5s. od. must be paid.

Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Organising Secretary, to prevent duplication.
