ANNUAL REPORT, 1921-1922.

Your Executive begs to submit the following Report for the year ending September 30th, 1922.

Shortly, the past year may be summarised as one of very considerable Civity, of disappointments overcome, and of unbounded optimism for the future. Primarily it is disappointing find a further small decrease in numbers and, although this may partly be due to prevailing local conditions which have unfortunately been even worse than in the preceding year, the question of this continued retrogressive movement in he numerical strength is a cause of serious anxiety. Complaints come from the east end that there are plenty of boys but few Scoutmasters, while the west end complain that their Scoutmasters have insufficient boys to keep the troops in a state of efficiency and, in some cases, even in existence. There appears to be here one cause why Scouting in Sheffield is not going forward with the leaps and bounds which once characterised it, and it is a condition to be greatly deplored. Some means should be sought of drawing all parts of the City together for the common good. That the 3,000 odd Scouts in this Association are worthily upholding traditions cannot, however, be doubted and will, it is hoped, be proved by this Report.

A second great disappointment is that the Association's Scheme for becoming a "County" has met with fatal opposition at the hands of Headquarters Advisers. After much long and careful deliberation by a Special Sub-Committee, by the Executive and by Divisions a complete New Constitution was drawn up only to meet the fate referred to. Whilst disclaiming responsibility for any unfortunate consequences which may arise, the Executive recommends that the decision of Headquarters be accepted with loyalty.

Splendid new Headquarters have been taken in West Street on lease for 9½ years, and an Equipment Department has been started. Thanks to the activity of the Equipment Committee and the hard work put in by Scoutmaster Revill, who has been placed in charge, the shop has proved very popular and has met with welcome and encouraging success, of which more will be heard in the Financial Report. In this connection the Executive wish to place on record their appreciation of the help and support given by the Sheffield Council of Social Service.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the Cutlers' Hall, when the Master Cutler, the late Mr. Marmaduke Wardlow, J.P., was in the chair and moved the adoption of the Annual Report. A number of trophies and Diplomas were presented and the Association received a gift in the form of a Statuette from their Chairman, Mr. A. Harland, as a memento of his visit to Canada. Your Executive cannot let this opportunity pass without expressing their deep sympathy with the family of the late Mr. Wardlow in their recent sad loss.

SPORTS.

The same football leagues as last year namely "The Leslie," "The Harland" and "The Pearson" have been organised and inter-Association Sports Fixtures have been held in conjunction with the Boys' Brigade and Boys' Life Brigade. The Scouts gained four victories by beating the Boys' Brigade and the Boys' Life Brigade in both the senior and junior football matches, but they lost to these Associations in the two corresponding cricket events. The Scouts won the Edgar Allen Banner for swimming by beating the Boys' Brigade and the Boys' Life Brigade.

The following items stand out as very particularly meritotious.

100 yards Yorkshire Junior Swimming Championship won by Scout C. Howard of the 11th Troop and Scout G. Bartlett of the same Troop was runner up in the 100 vards Yorkshire Senior Swimming Championship. Scoutmaster G. W. Parker, 119th Troop, played Water Polo for Yorkshire and in the English Trial Match.

HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement.

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books give some very sound advice as to the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as a Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can

take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

4. Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way, it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Head-quarters, for the management of Troop Finance, and for the recommendation for the appointment or dismissal of a Scoutmaster.

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

8. After three months apply to the Secretary, G. V. Dalby, Scout Office, 84, West Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Com-

mittee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol Leaders should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied, the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Secretary, to prevent duplication.

10. Read "Headquarter's Gazette" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any Bookseller or from Local Headquarters; on the 15th of each month, price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP

1. Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches, the rent is usually nominal.

2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.

3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.

4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt, and staff, can be obtained at the cost of about fifteen shillings.

5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
