General Sir Robert Baden-Powell's Scout Movement is one of the most popular and successful of all the organisations started to give boys a manly, courageous outlook on life. Backwoodsmen, frontiersmen, sea rovers, etc., are his heroes, and through woodcraft, nature study, and camping, he is led on to acquire their qualities of self-reliance and resource, bodily health and energy, technical skill and handicraft, and a sense of service to the community.

Endeavours have been made to frame rules on such broad lines as embrace all classes and all creeds, while allowing the greatest possible independence to individual organisations, officers and boys.

Citizenship and character training are the foundation of all Scout work, One aim of the Boy Scout scheme is to revive amongst us, if possible, some of the rules of the knights of old, which did so much for the moral tone of our race. The object is not so much to discipline the boys of to teach them to discipline themselves.

On enrolment the Scout makes the following promise:-On my honour I promise that I will do my best-To do my duty to God and the King, TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE AT ALL TIMES, TO OBEY THE SCOUT LAW.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1922-1923.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following Report for the year ending September 30th, 1923, and in doing so they wish to express their belief that, although the numerical strength of the Association has only slightly exceeded that of the previous year, there has been, nevertheless, a general improvement in the standard of efficiency.

In the absence of any outside effort, other than that of the "Posse of Welcome" to H.R.H. The Prince of Wales at the Alexandra Palace, it has been found possible to devote closer attention to the work at the troop headquarters and this was evinced by the keenness shown during the camping season, and to the fact that Officers, by the attendance at the courses at Gillwell or elsewhere, have done much towards the attainment of scouting ideals. It has been specially gratifying to receive very excellent reports, almost without exception, from the Commissioners in whose Districts our boys have camped.

Owing to financial stringency, it was not possible to assist those who attended the demonstration of loyalty to H.R.H. The Prince of Wales at the Alexandra Palace; nevertheless, some 150 of our Scouts were present, and it was recognised that the contribution by the Sheffield Association, in providing Fire Brigade and Ambulance displays, was of material assistance to the great success of the Rally. Special thanks are due to Mr. F. W. Hadwick, late Superintendent of the Sheffield Fire Brigade, for so ably organising the Fire Brigade Displays, and to Mr. R. Whitworth, who was in charge of the Ambulance section; the Association wish to express their further thanks to the Leyland Motor Company, Ltd., who rendered the exhibition possible by the free loan of a fire engine of the latest type.

A further opportunity of demonstrating our loyalty to H.R.H. The Prince of Wales was afforded on the occasion of his visit to Sheffield in May, when, at the request of Lieut.-Col. J. Hall-Dalwood—the Chief Constable and Assistant Commissioner—a large contingent of Scouts lined part of the route. A letter of appreciation from St. James' Palace was subsequently received by the Organising Secretary, London Headquarters, complimenting the Sheffield Scouts on the efficiency and steadiness displayed on the occasion of the visit of His Royal Highness.

The Executive record with great satisfaction the success of our team of 10 boys, all under 18, who competed for the Boy Scouts' International Shield for Swimming. The Shield was won at their first attempt, and all previous records were beaten; Durban (South Africa), Antwerp, Brussels, and Spain also competed for the Trophy. Much praise is accorded to Scout Master G. W. Parker for his efficient training of the team.

The Swimming Team, together with several members of other Troops, in charge of Commissioner A. Harland and Assistant Commissioner Rev. H. Ewbank, paid a most interesting visit to Belgium at the special invitation of the Committee of the Belgian National Scout Swimming Festival at Antwerp. Our team competed successfully in the sports, and every facility was afforded the party when visiting Bruges, Brussels and the adjacent battlefields.

Another party of Scouts, under Scoutmaster A. W. Gaskin, visited the newly acquired International Scouts Home at Kandersteg, Switzerland. Our warmest thanks are due to those who have contributed so much to our enjoyment on these occasions, and your Executive feel it is by means of these International visits that the realization of the great Brotherhood existing between Scouts of all nations is possible.

The usual Football competitions have been organised, namely, the "Leslie" for boys over 16, the "Harland" for those under 16, and the "Pearson" for Wolf Cubs, all games having been keenly contested. Inter-Association Football Fixtures have also been held in conjunction with the Boys' Brigade and Boys' Life Brigade. Unfortunately, it was not found possible to arrange any Inter-Association Cricket Matches, owing to the difficulty in obtaining suitable grounds. Endeavours are being made to obtain a football field for the coming season at a low rent and also to revive interest in Boxing Competitions. The Annual Swimming Gala was held at the Attercliffe Baths, under the Chairmanship of Alderman W. F. Wardley, J.P., proceeds of the Gala being devoted to the Rover Scouts Fresh Air Fund.

It is pleasing to note the number of Troops who are working out their own salvation by providing their own huts as Headquarters, and in all cases the actual erection of the huts has been accomplished by the Scouts, under the direction of their Officers

The anticipation of a Magazine of our own had been looked forward to for some time past, and your Executive cordially welcome the appearance of "Woodsmoke," the publication of which reflects great credit on its Editor, Mr. G. V. Dalby.

The success of the Equipment Department under the able supervision of Assistant Scoutmaster C. C. Hale has been assured

and it was only the lack of further capital that prevented even more encouraging results.

Before the close of the year sanction was given by Headquarters to our new constitutional Bye-Laws. Although much disappointment is felt that Sheffield has not been given the status of a "County," the formation of "Divisions," with their functional responsibilities, has now received official recognition.

The Executive regret that the expenditure for the year exceeded the income by £163/6/9, it would have been necessarily greater if the Equipment Department had not shown a satisfactory profit.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the Montgomery Hall, Commissioner A. Harland, J.P., in the Chair. The adoption of the Annual Report was moved by Mr. Arthur Neal, J.P., and seconded by Dr. F. E. Wynne. The numerous Trophies and Diplomas were presented by Alderman W. F. Wardley, J.P., and the Honorary Officers for the ensuing year were appointed.

The number of Badges and Warrants issued is approximately the same as in the preceding year.

Clarke and the band of the 35th Shefield (St. Oswald's) Troop, and also to the many artists who so willingly contributed to the programme.

At the much-appreciated request of our County Commissioner, Lieut.-Col. J. H. Leslie, R.A., a party of Scouts, in charge of Assistant Scoutmaster A. S. Wood, was detailed to act as orderlies at the Yorkshire Show. Their usefulness and general smartness received very favourable comment from the officials of the Show.

Subsequent to the appointment of 10 new Assistant District Commissioners, your Executive Committee were very kindly invited to dinner by their Chairman, Mr. A. Harland, in order to welcome the newly-appointed Officers. The compliment was greatly appreciated by all, and further interest was added by the

### HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement.

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books give some very sound advice as to the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as a Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can

take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

4. Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of ix or eight

boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Head-quarters, for the management of Troop Finance, and to the recommendation for the appointment or dismissal of a Scoutmester.

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the cop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends

would like to entrust the Troop if they leave
8. After three months apply to the Scretary, G. V. Dalby, Scout
Office, 84, West Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol leaders should be well up in Tender-foot work. If the visitor is satisfied, the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual

Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive

colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Secretary, to prevent duplication.

10. Read "The Secuter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any Bookseller of from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month price 3d.

### COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.

2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.

3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.

4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at the cost of about fifteen shillings.

5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
