General Sir Robert Baden-Powell's Scout Movement is one of the most popular and successful of all the organisations started to give boys a manly, courageous outlook on life. Backwoodsmen, frontiersmen, sea rovers, etc., are his heroes, and through woodcraft, nature study, and camping, he is led on to acquire their qualities of self-reliance and resource, bodily health and energy, technical skill and handcraft, and a sense of service to the community.

Endeavours have been made to frame rules on such broad lines as to embrace all classes and all creeds, while allowing the greatest possible independence to individual organisations, officers and boys.

Citizenship and character training are the foundation of all Scout work. One aim of the Boy Scout scheme is to revive amongst us, if possible, some of the rules of the knights of old, which did so much for the moral tone of our race. The object is not so much to discipline the boys as to teach them to discipline themselves.

On enrolment the Scout makes the following promise:—

On my honour I promise that I will do my best—

TO DO MY DUTY TO GOD AND THE KING,

TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE AT ALL TIMES,

TO OBEY THE SCOUT LAW.

THE SCOUT LAW is—

- (1) A Scout's honour is to be trusted.
- (2) A Scout is loyal to the King, his country, his officers, his parents, his employers, and to those under him.
- (3) A Scout's duty is to be useful and to help others.
- (4) A Scout is a friend to all, and a brother to every other Scout, no matter to what social class the other belongs.
- (5) A Scout is courteous.
- (6) A Scout is a friend to animals.
- (7) A Scout obeys orders of his parents, patrol leader, or Scout-master without question.
- (8) A Scout smiles and whistles under all difficulties.
- (9) A Scout is thrifty.
- (10) A Scout is clean in thought, word and deed.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1923-24.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following report for the year ending September 30th, 1924. They regret that the numerical strength of the Association is now 2919 as against 3399 last year, a decrease of nearly 500.

The year has been a very eventful one, comprising a number of incidents of great importance to scouting in general and to the Local Association in particular.

With the object of raising funds for the Local Association a Scout Fair and Exhibition was held in November at the Cutler's Hall. It lasted for four days, on which it was opened by Chief Scout Commissioner Emlyn, the Countess Fitzwilliam, Sir Keith Smith and Major-General Sir Frederick Sykes successively. Thanks to the untiring work of the Hon. Secretary, Mrs. J. K. Jonas, the Committee and Stallholders, the Fair resulted in a financial gain of £730 3s. 4d. The Scoutcraft Exhibition, under Mr. F. W. Hadwick, attracted much attention. A stall was also provided by the Sheffield Rover Scouts at the Christmas Fair organised by the Council of Social Service.

At the beginning of the New Year, H.Q. were moved from No. 84 West Street to their present position in Holly Street. The old H.Q. were very cramped and the Council of Social Service, the landlords, were anxious to take possession of the whole premises which we had hitherto shared with them. Suitable premises were found at 33, Holly Street, and though the tenancy is only a yearly one, it is hoped that the Association will be able to retain them for some time to come. A Reading Room for Scout Officers has been opened, and the Equipment Dept. has far roomier quarters than before. The thanks of the Association are due to several members of the Executive, notably Mr. Bashforth, Mr. Stevens and Mr. Hale for their valuable assistance and advice concerning the new H.Q.

H.R.H. the Duke of York visited Sheffield on April 10th, when he handed the flag, which he himself presented for competition by the Scouts of Yorkshire, to the winners, the

26th (St. Mark's) Troop. This Troop is to be heartily congratulated on having again won the flag for Sheffield this year.

The Imperial Jamboree was held at Wembley at the beginning of August and was attended by 13,000 Scouts from every part of the Empire. Sheffield sent a contingent of 350 Scouts under Assistant District Commissioner the Rev. T. M. Garaway, and they spent a week at Alperton Council School which had been secured for them for this purpose. The programme consisted of numerous visits to the British Empire Exhibition and sight-seeing tours in London. Scouts J. Green, W. Blackwell, J. W. Marshall, Kelsey, J. Holmes and Henderson represented Sheffield in the Athletic Competitions held at the Stadium. In the Mile Relay the Sheffield team were second, Hampstead Rovers winning the event.

Immediately after Wembley an International Jamboree was held in Denmark at Copenhagen, at which thirty-one nations were represented. The first week was spent in camp at Ermelunden, during the course of which the Scouts were visited by the King of Denmark and the Chief Scout. International competitions were held in which Great Britain was second, the United States being first. During the second week the Scouts were billeted in Danish homes, and a daily expedition was made to places of interest in and near Copenhagen. A party of some 40 Sheffield Scouts under S/M. Gaskin took part in the Jamboree, Mr. Albert Harland being also in the party. In spite of a rough passage on the way out the party had a most interesting and enjoyable trip via the Kiel Canal, and every member on his return was enthusiastic about Danish hospitality. It would be difficult to exaggerate the benefits to be derived from these international gatherings.

The Association has been delighted to receive a visit from two parties of Overseas Scouts, one from Natal and the other from New South Wales. Both parties were officially received by the Lord Mayor of Sheffield and they were taken to various works in the City. Sheffield Scouts were very glad to have the opportunity of entertaining the New South Wales Scouts when they spent the night at Sheffield.

During the Winter, visits to Sheffield were made by the Chief Wolf Cub Commissioner, Mr. N. D. Power, who addressed a meeting of Cubs, and the Editor of "The Scout," Mr. Hadyn Dimmock, who gave a lecture on how the paper is produced.

A Church Parade was held on St. George's Day at the Cathedral, the Archdeacon of Sheffield preaching the sermon.

The Executive Committee have been very pleased to note the efforts of several of the Divisions to raise funds by means of Sports, Bazaars, etc., all of these have been successful. Special praise also is due to the Pitsmoor Troop for the building and opening of their own hut.

Mr. Albert Harland, the Chairman of the Executive Committee was elected as an M.P. for Ecclesall at the last General Election, and he felt compelled, on account of his new duties, to resign the Chairmanship, though he has fortunately been able to continue to fulfil his duties as District Commissioner. The Executive Committee wish to record their profound appreciation of Mr. Harland's unfailing energy and resourcefulness throughout the long period he has held the post of Chairman.

Capt. W. Harland was elected to succeed him as Chairman.

Mr. B. C. Davies has resigned the post of Assistant District Commissioner of the Southern Division, and the vacancy has not as yet been filled. The hearty thanks of the Association are again due to Mr. Davies for kindly auditing the Annual Accounts. The financial position of the Association gives rise to some concern, the expenses of the past year having been heavy. The subscription list is very small for so large a city as Sheffield, and last year it only totalled some £130. The report of the Equipment Department however, is very satisfactory, the trade of the department continues to increase, and it accomplishes its chief object; that of supplying reliable equipment to Scouts at a reasonable price; in addition, the Scouts themselves benefit, as £115 was paid back to them last year in discount. It is hoped that the department will be the means of supplying the Association with an annual income of not less than £150. The success of the department reflects great credit on its honorary secretary, S/M. C. C. Hale, the Quartermaster Mr. Revill, and his assistant Miss Revill.

Mr. G. V. Dalby has resigned his appointment as Organizing Secretary of the Sheffield Local Association. Mr. Dalby has been with the Association for 5½ years, during which he has accomplished great things for Scouting in Sheffield. The best wishes of the Association will follow him wherever new duties may take him.

S/M. Parker of 119th Troop (Brightside Village) played for Yorkshire in all their matches at water polo, and was selected for the Olympic Games Trial. Rover Biddulph of the 11th (Pitsmoor) is to be congratulated on winning the Open Mile at the Army, Navy, Air Force and Territorial Sports held in June at Woolwich.

The Silver Medal for Gallantry has been awarded by the Chief Scout to Scout W. H. Ashton of the 84th Sheffield Troop for attempting to rescue a man from drowning in the sea at Filey on July 29th, 1923. The medal was presented to him by Major-General Sir F. Sykes at the Scouts' Fair.

"Woodsmoke," the publication of the Local Association, has just celebrated its first birthday. It has been a valuable record of events and has reflected great credit on its Editor, Mr. Dalby. The Executive hope that with increasing circulation it will very shortly pay its way, but the paper has not yet received all the support it deserves from individual members of the Association. The price is only 1d. per month, and every Scout should try to buy a copy, in every one of which he will find much to interest him.

HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement.

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books give some very sound advice as to the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

4. Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Headquarters, for the management of Troop Finance, and for the appointment or dismissal of a Scoutmaster.

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

8. After three months apply to the Secretary, Scout Office, 33, Holly Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol Leaders should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied, the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

The Affiliation Fee is paid to the Association, and the Annual Subscription is paid to the Division, through the Divisional Hon. Treasurer.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Secretary, to prevent duplication.

10. Read "The Scouter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any bookseller or from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

1. Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.

2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.

3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.

4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at a cost of about fifteen shillings.

5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
