ANNUAL REPORT, 1924-25.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following report for the year ending September 30th, 1925.

The year has not, like the last, included any spectacular events such as a jamboree, but it has been one of progress. The number of officers has increased, and six new troops and six new packs have been affiliated. The total increase of all ranks, moreover, is 387 as compared with a decrease of nearly 500 in 1924.

Perhaps the most important event of the year has been the inception of a scheme of training for Scout and Cub Officers, under the leadership of A.D.C., A. W. Gaskin.

The winter sessions consist of demonstrations of scouting activities, visits to troops and packs, lectures, debates, etc.; during the spring and summer, outdoor scouting and cubbing will be added so that members of the course will learn in a practical manner a great variety of outdoor games, and will take part in hikes, week-end camps, and walks for the observation of nature. The course is open to warrant-holders, to those who may think of applying for warrants, to rovers, and to patrol leaders of sufficient age, who are recommended by their Scoutmaster.

A Scout Conference was held on April 25th, at the Cutlers' Hall. Major Mawe gave a stirring address and he was supported by local scout-workers. The thanks of the Association are due to the Master Cutler for the loan of the Hall and for his presence at the Conference.

Since the resignation of Mr. Dalby, the duties of Organising Secretary have been carried out by Mr. J. Cunningham. The Executive and the Association owe a great deal to Mr. Cunningham for the immense amount of work he has done for the Association and for his able organising; he has now retired from this post,

but fortunately will not by any means sever his connection with the movement. It is hoped that the new system (for which Mr. Cunningham is largely responsible) of decentralising several branches of activity amongst the Honorary Secretaries of divisions and subcommittees, will keep the Executive more closely in touch with the Association as a whole.

In order to assist the Honorary Secretary and Honorary Treasurer, it has been decided to appoint a Secretary to the Executive, and also an Assistant Treasurer; Mr. J. E. Swinburn has been selected for the former position, and the Quarter-master, Mr. Revill, has undertaken the duties of the latter.

The Executive Committee have approved the principle of having a paid organising Secretary "who shall further scouting" in Sheffield (as opposed to purely Secretarial work), and it is intended to make an appointment as soon as funds permit.

The Equipment Department continues to make good progress, amply fulfilling the expectation of its promoters. This year, after allowing a liberal amount for depreciation, the department will hand over to the Association, a profit of £167, after paying back to the troops supporting the department a discount of £141/17/1. The turnover has increased this year by over £1000, a fact which reflects great credit on the Hon. Secretary of the Department, Mr. Hale, while the success of the Department is also due to the Quarter-master, Mr. Revill, and his assistant, Miss Revill.

"Woodsmoke," the Local Association publication, has continued to render excellent service to scouting in Sheffield, thanks to its Editor, Dr. Mary Andrews, and its articles have maintained their high standard. It is felt, however, that scouts do not yet do everything they might, to assist the paper, either in the way of encouraging sales, or obtaining advertisements.

During August, a party of 22 Sheffield Scouts spent a fortnight in visiting the International Scout Home at Kandersteg in Switzerland. The party was led by A.D.C., A. W. Gaskin, and was joined by five members of the 11th North London Troop; both in Switzerland and in Paris, and London, where days were spent in sight-seeing, the visit was greatly enjoyed by all who took part in it. Thanks are due to the Swiss and Paris Scouts, and to the 11th North London Troop for their hospitality.

Two Church parades have been held during the year, one at St. Paul's on October 19th, and one at the Cathedral on St. George's Day.

Sheffield has lost the Duke of York's Flag this year to Ripon, the 26th St Mark's Troop being second in the competition, 3 points behind the winners.

The Rovers have had a successful year; committee meetings have been well attended, and Dectures, Discussions, and Dances have been organised. Representatives have attended conferences at Oldham and Doncaster. The Rovers have had the misfortune to lose their Commissioner, Mr. Holmstrom, who is travelling in the Far East, but are to be congratulated on having Rev. E. W. Selwyn, as his successor.

As regards the Wolf Cubs, the small number of packs entered for the various trophies, has been rather disappointing, but this has been off set, by the keenness of the teams and the high quality of work shewn; it is hoped that entries will be better next year.

1925 will be remembered by the Cubs because of the holding of the first Wolf Cub Rally in Sheffield, at the Teachers' Training College grounds, on September 5th. The Rally was opened by the Countess Fitzwilliam, Lieut.-Col. J. H. Leslie acting as Chairman. In spite of bad weather the event, which took the form of divisional displays and races, was a great success; the central division won a new trophy, which will in future be competed for annually.

One of the most popular events of the year, was the "Pageant of Scouting," organised by the Northern Division, and held on the 29th and 30th April, and 1st and 2nd May, in the Wostenholm Hall. It was organised to raise funds for the Division and for the Troops in the Division, and also to foster the spirit of brotherhood between the members of the various troops. A profit of £145 was realised, of which nearly 70% was returned to the 9 Troops which participated. The success of the Pageant was largely due to the loyal co-operation of the various Troops and to the help given by many friends outside the Movement. The members of the Northern Division are to be congratulated on the success achieved in running the Pageant, which is the first combined Divisional effort of this nature to be held in Sheffield.

HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books give some very sound advice as of the running fo a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can take pride and

pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Thoop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble that there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight

boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Headquarters, for the management of Troop Finance, and for the appointment or dismissal of a Scoutmaster.

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

Immediately apply to the Secretary Scout Office, 33, Holly Street,

Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol Leaders should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

The Affiliation Fee is paid to the Association, and the Annual Subscription is paid to the Division through the Divisional Hon. Treasurer.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Secretary to prevent

duplication.

10. Read The Scouter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through the latest month, any Bookseller or from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month,

price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

 Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.

2. Cost of establishing a Troop: Anaffiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.

3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.

4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at a cost of about fifteen shillings.

5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
