Endeavours have been made to frame rules on such broad lines as to embrace all classes and all creeds, while allowing the greatest possible independence to individual organisations, officers and boys.

Citizenship and character training are the foundation of all Scout work. One aim of the Boy Scout scheme is to revive amongst us if possible, some of the rules of the knights of old, which did so much for the moral tone of our race. The object is not so much to discipline the boys as to teach them to discipline themselves.

 - (7) A Scout obeys orders of his parents, patrol leader, or Scoutmaster without question.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1925-26.

The Executive Committee beg to submit the following Report for the year ending September 30th, 1926.

The Census taken on 30th September, 1926, shows the total membership of the Association to be 3,498, an increase of 192 on that of 1925; 4 new Troops and 6 new Packs have been formed during the year, and there are now 70 Troops and 54 Packs affiliated.

The two main events of the year have been the decision to remove the Headquarters and the appointment of an Organiser.

HEADQUARTERS.

In April the Association were requested by the Town Clerk to vacate the present Headquarters as soon as possible, as these were to be pulled down to make room for the City Memorial Hall. Though the Association were legally entitled to remain at Holly Street until March, 1927, the Executive were unanimously of the opinion that in consideration of the many favours shown by the City Authorities to the Association in the past and also of the object for which the request was made every endeavour should be made to accede to the request as early as possible. A Sub-Committee was appointed, and after a protracted search new Headquarters were found in the Central Telephone Exchange. The new Headquarters are much smaller than the old, consisting only of a shop, a small store room and a small office. It is greatly to be regretted that the office is not large enough to accommodate Divisional Meetings, and that Divisions will accordingly be compelled to look elsewhere. On the other hand the frontage is much better than before, and the office will be sufficiently large for the needs of the Organiser and for Sub-Committee Meetings. It is hoped that in time funds will permit the Executive to hire a large room for divisional meetings.

THE ORGANISER.

The Executive extend a hearty welcome to the new Organiser, Mr. Muirhead, and they are confident that he will be able to render great service to the movement locally. They wish to emphasize that they regard the duties of an Organiser as relating primarily to the assistance of new troops and inexperienced Scoutmasters, and to the furthering of scouting in Sheffield, and that it is not intended that Mr. Muirhead shall be over-burdened with secretarial work to the exclusion of his other duties.

VISIT OF MAJOR HEYDEMAN.

During the Spring Major H. Heydeman visited Sheffield; the Association owe him a great deal for his inspiring talks and his willing assistance in all phases of scouting. The Executive sincerely hope that circumstances may bring Major Heydeman back to Sheffield again in the near future.

SUBSCRIPTIONS.

The small numbers of Subscribers to the Association is regarded with some concern. Times are bad in Sheffield, but it is hoped nevertheless that all will co-operate in an endeavour to raise the list to a considerably higher level. The Executive gratefully acknowledge the promise of a grant of £100 from the Sheffield Town Trustees.

EQUIPMENT DEPARTMENT.

The Equipment Department is once more most satisfactory. The turnover has again increased by over £1,000, while various troops have received by way of discounts a total of £195/18/1. There is no doubt that the success of this department has exceeded the expectations of even its most sanguine promoters. The Executive wish to place on record their appreciation of the untiring activities of Mr. Hale as Hon. Secretary to this department and the strenuous work and keen business acumen of the Quartermaster, Mr. Revill, and his staff, which have been instrumental in producing such excellent results.

THE TRAINING TROOP AND PACK.

The scheme of Training of Officers initiated during last year has developed into the formation of the Training Troop and Pack, the Scoutmaster being A.D.C. A. W. Gaskin. Members of the Troop and Pack numbered forty-four in July, and their varied activities have aroused great interest. In addition to four week-end camps the year's programme has included much practical scouting, and a series of games against the divisions has been played. Great credit is due to Mr. Gaskin for the success of this important work he has undertaken.

WOLF CUBS.

The second Annual Wolf Cub Rally was held at the Teachers' Training College grounds on July 17th, and was favoured with excellent weather. Alderman W. F. Wardley, J.P., opened the Rally and presented the prizes Mr. A. Harland acting as Chairman. Divisional displays and sports events occupied most of the programme, and the Northern Division is to be congratulated on

winning the Wolf Cub Shield. There has been a gratifying increase in the number of Packs entering for the Competition, but it is still felt that more packs could compete.

"WOODSMOKE,"

The Local Association publication, "Woodsmoke," continues to assist scouting locally. Dr. Mary Andrews, the Editor, has introduced several new features during the year, including a new cover design which has proved popular. Since Mr. Chapman has taken over the business management of "Woodsmoke," the sales and number of advertisements have greatly increased. He is to be congratulated on his work, which, if it continues as it has begun, will reduce the cost of "Woodsmoke" to a minimum.

ROVERS

The new Rover Commissioner, the Rev. E. W. Selwyn, has effected great improvements in the organisation of the Rovers. These have now their own Sub-Committee of the Executive which controls the issue of badges and limits membership to young men really keen on "Service." The long-standing deficit on the Redmires scheme has been cleared off, leaving everyone free to concentrate on Rover activities. A party from Sheffield attended the Great Rover Moot in London, the lessons learnt there making them more determined than ever to stage a Conference in Sheffield. This project was very successfully accomplished in May, despite the General Strike. Rovers from many parts of the country attended, and the Acting Chief Commissioner, Mr. P. B. Nevill, motored from London in order to be present.

"TELEGRAPH AND STAR" DOLL SHOW.

The Association supplied to this exhibition a tableau representing a camp scene. The tableau was made by the 11th Sheffield (Pitsmoor) Troop, and was afterwards presented to the Cripples' Home at Rivelin.

SWIMMING.

A Scout team, consisting of Scouts from the 11th, 107th and 150th Troops competed for the Edgar Allen Trophy and gained second place, losing to the Boys' Life Brigade.

FOOTBALL.

A match was played against the Nottingham Scouts, our team being defeated.

THE DUKE OF YORK'S FLAG.

Sheffield was again represented in the Duke of York's Flag Competition by the 26th (St. Mark's) Troop, who gained second place.

VISIT OF CHIEF COMMISSIONER.

In December the Chief Commissioner, Major The Lord Hampton, D.S.O., D.L., visited Rotherham and gave an address in the Parish

Church. Over 1,000 Sheffield Scouts attended, and the church was filled to its utmost capacity.

CHURCH PARADE.

Two Church Parades have been held during the year, one at the Upper Chapel on November 1st, and one at the Cathedral on St. George's Day. After the parade on November 1st the Association marched to the City War Memorial and there placed a wreath in memory of the Scouts who fell in the War.

BROADCASTING.

The Broadcasting Sub-Committee have arranged with the Sheffield Station of the B.B.C. for the broadcasting of subjects of scouting interest on the first Thursday in every month. The talks up to the present have been :-

June 3rd. "Scouting and the Public," by Major Heydeman. July 1st. "Camping," by A. W. Gaskin.

Aug. 5th. "The Scout Spirit," by R. Whitworth.

Sept. 2nd. "Summer Camps," by A. Harland.

On October 2nd a camp fire sing-song was broadcast from the grounds of Westbrook, kindly lent by Capt. C. C. Harland, by the members of the Training Troop Pack and other scouts, the programme being arranged by Mr. Gaskin. This was a great success. The Committee desire to thank the Station Director of the Sheffield B.B.C. and his staff for their enthusiastic co-operation and help on all occasions.

DESPATCH RUNS.

A series of despatch runs, organised by the A.D.C. in charge of Training for the purpose of studying this game took place during the summer. In every case a member of the Training Troop attempted to carry a written despatch through an area guarded by the opponents, with the following results:-

ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the Channing Hall, the Lord Mayor (Alderman Bailey) in the Chair. The adoption of the report was moved by the Lord Mayor and seconded by the Lord Bishop of Sheffield. The adoption of the Balance Sheet was proposed by Sir Alfred Pickford, who kindly came down from Imperial H.O. for the occasion, and seconded by Mr. A. Harland. The trophies and diplomas were presented by Sir Alfred Pickford and the honorary officers for the ensuing year elected. The thanks of the Association are extended to the local Press for their consistent help, and to the many supporters and subscribers who have given their valuable assistance.

HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement.

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books

give some very sound advice as of the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound toop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than it there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight

boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' pents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Headquarters, and for the management of Troop Finance

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if the leave the troop is the continuity of like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

8. Immediately apply to the Secretary, Sort Office, Telephone Building,

West Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol Caners should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied, the proposed for affiliation. After election, an Affiliation pee of Five Shillings and an Annual Sub-

scription of Five Shillings must be paid.

The Affiliation Fee is part to the Association, and the Annual Subscription is paid to the Division, though the Divisional Hon. Treasurer.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Secretary to prevent duplication.

10. Read Cric Scouter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any Bookseller of from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month, price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

- 1. Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.
- 2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.
- 3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.
- 4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at a cost of about fifteen shillings.
- 5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
