ANNUAL REPORT, 1926-27.

The Executive Committee submit the following Report for the year ending the 30th September, 1927.

CENSUS

The membership of the Local Association is now 4,032, there having been an increase in its numbers during the past year of 534. This in itself is a sufficient indication of the strength and popularity of the movement in Sheffield.

The number of Troops is 79, an increase of 9, and the number of Packs is 60, an increase of 8.

EVENTS OF THE YEAR.

Early in the summer the Executive Committee decided that the Association's greatest need was a Camping Ground not far from the City, to which every troop could have easy access with a minimum of trouble and expense. An appeal was accordingly launched and it resulted in the receipt of a sum which, though substantial, was not sufficient to enable the Committee to carry out their project. A second appeal is being made, and it is hoped that this will provide sufficient funds to permit a start being made. A supporter of the movement has very kindly promised a donation of £25 towards the fund, provided that 10 others will give the same amount.

The year has been marked on every side by increased activity, which generally derives its origin from the energies of the Organiser, Mr. Muirhead, who never spares himself in his efforts to stimulate popular interest in Scouting. The credit for the increase in the number of troops and packs is due to him.

Annual Meeting 1926.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the Channing Hall, the Lord Mayor (Alderman Benson) in the Chair. The adoption of the Annual Report was moved by Alderman Benson and seconded by Dr. Arthur Hall; the adoption of the Financial Statement was moved by Mr. Claude Fisher, of Imperial Head-quarters, and seconded by the Rev. A. Hall. The trophies and diplomas were presented by Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Leslie, the County Commissioner, and the honorary officers for the ensuing year were elected.

DINNER.

On March 19th, the District Commissioner, Mr. A. Harland, M.P., entertained the members of the Executive Committee and

Divisional Officers at Dinner at the King's Head Hotel. A very enjoyable evening was spent, and a number of speeches were made concerning the City and Scouting. Among the speakers were Alderman A. J. Blanchard, Mr. W. W. Chisholm, Mr. D. C. Leng, Alderman W. F. Wardley, Mr. W. Wood, Junior, and the Chairman.

Prize winners at the West Riding Musical Festival gave selections during the evening.

TRAINING TROOP AND PACK.

The Training Troop and Pack has now firmly established itself as an integral part of Scout life of Sheffield. During the Winter its activities were somewhat hindered by the absence of a headquarters, but it held together, and is now starting the new session with increased numbers and greater vigour than ever. Summer meetings were mostly held at Whiteley Wood Hall, and there was a very successful reunion camp on July 2nd and 3rd at Wind Hill. Sheffield is reaping the benefit of possessing the Training Troop and Pack, firstly in the spread of a splendid spirit of brotherly comradeship, and secondly in a better supply of instructed officers. Special features for 1927-8 are the separate training of Cub Officers, the improvement of our first-aid work, the further development of rambling and out-door work (Summer Session) and the introduction to the Gillwell Course. The Association owes to Mr. Gaskin a debt of gratitude for the able and enthusiastic manner in which he has carried on what is undoubtedly one of the most important of the Association activities.

FORMATION OF THE KING EDWARD VII SCHOOL TROOP.

A recent event that has attracted much attention is the formation of a troop at King Edward VII School. The registration certificate of the Troop was handed by the County Commissioner to Mr. Gaskin on July 26th, at a solemn Investiture of the first twenty Scouts of the School. Most of these boys attended a very enjoyable camp at Sawdon during the holidays, and during the Autumn Term the troop increased largely. There is every prospect of a great future for this troop, and it is hoped that other Schools will follow the example of King Edward's.

WHITELEY WOOD HAIL.

The very kind offer of Messrs. Wickers' to allow Scouts the use of the grounds at Whiteley Wood Hall led to an interesting experiment. Some troops and packs made good use of the opportunity, and in general the standard of their camping was good. There were three Demonstration Camps to which the Public was invited, but one of these was badly spoilt by the rainy weather. A Cub Camp, held in June, was very successful, and it gives an indication of what could be done if more extended camping grounds were

possessed by our Association. Such grounds would undoubtedly facilitate the correction of certain errors which some scouts commit in their camping, but for such a purpose the grounds of Whiteley Wood Hall must, at any rate in a sunnier Summer, prove quite inadequate.

The Association wish to convey to Messrs. Vickers' their thanks for their generous loan of the grounds, which was undoubtedly greatly appreciated and made use of by a large number of scouts.

ROVERS.

The Registration scheme has proved its value and 22 patrols are now registered. The subscriptions paid by them have resulted in the Rovers being able to pay their way. A standard has been fixed for Rover Badges. Volunteers for blood transfusion were called for and several gave blood. An Inter-patrol competition was held diving the summer, points being given for results of camp, hike and log.

SHEFFIELD UNIVERSITY SCOUT CLUB.

The Club which was formed in February last with the County Commissioner as President, for the purpose of creating an interest amongst the staff and students in the aims, objects and methods of Scouting, is still prospering and looks forward to a successful session in 1927-28. Three meetings were held last session, two in the Lent Term and one in the Summer Term, in addition to a ramble in the Easter Vacation. At the third meeting a very interesting address was given by Mr. Piers D. Power, the Imperial Head-quarters Assistant Commissioner for Universities, on "Scouting in the Universities." The chair was taken by Col. I, eslie and the Club extended a hearty welcome to the D.C., A.D.Cs' and other prominent members of the Local Association who were present.

VISIT TO TOC H.

On October 27th several members of the Executive Committee attended a meeting at Toc H. Headquarters; Capt. Harland, Mr. Whitworth, Mr. Chapman, Mr. Mason, Mr. Cocker, Mr. Muirhead and others spoke on the various aspects of Scouting, their remarks being followed by a discussion. It was felt that the two organisations could do much to help one another, and that these mutual conferences were useful in preventing overlapping and bringing together those who worked for the common ideal of service.

CAMPING.

In spite of the rainy weather this year more camping than ever has taken place throughout the Association, many troops holding a series of week-end camps, as well as the long summer camp. Whiteley Wood Hall was used by a number of patrols and troops each week-end, and in addition to the three Demonstration Camps held there, a camp was held at Wind Hill for Scouters and Rovers, which was well attended and proved most enjoyable.

WOLF CUBS.

The Cub section of the movement has shown greater enthusiasm than ever this year, and has increased in numbers, several new packs have been started and are going strong. The Cub Conference was held on April 30th and was attended by a great number of Cubmasters from other Associations, as well as our own Cubmasters. Mr. N. D. Power, the Chief Commissioner for Wolf Cubs came from Imperial Headquarters and conducted the Conference. Papers were read in the afternoon and discussed, and in the evening a display of games was given by the 150th, 131st, and the 85th packs.

The Cub Rally, which was organised by Mr. T. W. Chapman, took place on September 3rd, when displays were given by the various divisions, and sports were held. The Rally was opened and the prizes were presented by Mrs. Victor Sandford, and Mr. A. Harland, the District Commissioner, took the chair; a most enjoyable afternoon was spent.

The special camp for cubs and lady cubmasters was held at Whiteley Wood Hall from June 17th to the 20th. In spite of a downpour of rain on the Sunday night, the cubs enjoyed it and no ill-effects were felt.

"WOODSMOKE."

The Association Magazine has this year gone from strength to strength, the circulation has greatly improved, and the cost to the Association has been reduced from £27/5/8 last year to just over £7 this year. The editor, Dr. Mary Andrews, is to be congratulated on the continued excellence of the subject matter and general lay-out, and Mr. T. W. Chapman, the business manager, on the way he has increased not only the circulation but also the number of advertisements.

SPORTS.

The year has shewn a decided improvement on past years as regards sports. At football the Nottingham Scouts Association played the Sheffield Scouts Association, at Nottingham, in April, winning by 2 goals to 5. The Boys Brigade (Junior Section) played the Sheffield Scouts, in April, and the result was a draw 4-4. The Scouts Association played the Doys' Brigade (Senior) in April, but the match had to be abandoned after fifty minutes' play. HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lav hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books

give some very sound advice as of the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

4. Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound troop. which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight

boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Headquarters, and for the management of Troop Finance

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would

like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

8. Immediately apply to the Secretary Scott Office, Telephone Building, 10, West Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop of a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol readers should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

The Affiliation Fee is part to the Association, and the Annual Subscription is paid to the Division through the Divisional Hon. Treasurer.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Quartermaster to

prevent duplication.

10. Read "The Scouter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any Bookseller or from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month, price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

- 1. Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.
- 2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.
- 3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.
- 4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at a cost of about fifteen shillings.
- Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessaries.
