General Sir Robert Baden-Powell's Scout Movement is one of the most popular and successful of all the organisations started to give boys a manly, courageous outlook on life. Backwoodsmen, frontiersmen, sea rovers, etc., are his heroes, and through woodcraft, nature study, and camping, he is led on to acquire their qualities of self-reliance and resource, bodily health and energy, technical skill and handicraft, and a sense of service to the community.

Endeavours have been made to frame rules on such broad lines as to embrace all classes and all creeds, while allowing the greatest possible independence to individual organisations, officers and boys.

Citizenship and character training are the foundation of all Scout work. One aim of the Boy Scout scheme is to revive amongst us, if possible, some of the rules of the knights of old, which did so much for the moral tone of our race. The object is not so much to discipline the boys as to teach them to discipline themselves.

THE SCOUT PROMISE.

On enrolment the Scout makes the following promise:—

On my honour I promise that I will do my best—

TO DO MY DUTY TO GOD AND THE KING,

TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE AT ALL TIMES,

TO OBEY THE SCOUT LAW.

THE SCOUT LAW is:—

- (1) A Scout's honour is to be trusted.
- (2) A Scout is loyal to the King, his country, his officers, his parents, his employers, and to those under him.
- (3) A Scout's duty is to be useful and to help others.
- (4) A Scout is a friend to all, and a brother to every other Scout, no matter to what social class the other belongs.
- (5) A Scout is courteous.
- (6) A Scout is a friend to animals.
- (7) A Scout obeys orders of his parents, patrol leader, or Scoutmaster without question.
- (8) A Scout smiles and whistles under all difficulties.
- (9) A Scout is thrifty.
- (10) A Scout is clean in thought, word and deed.

ANNUAL REPORT, 1927-28.

The Executive Committee present their Report for the year ending the 30th September, 1928. They are glad to be able to report that the membership of the Association has increased by 212, the total membership being now 4,244. The number of troops is 79, the number of Wolf Cub packs 65, an increase of 5. An extremely satisfactory feature of the census, and one which promises well for the future, is the increase in the number of Scout Officers from 264 to 326.

EVENTS OF THE YEAR.—CAMP SITE.

The Special Appeal issued in 1927 on behalf of the Camp Fund produced a total of £475. Although this sum demonstrates the great interest which the public takes in the Boy Scout Movement, it was not sufficient to enable the Association actually to purchase a camp ground. After a protracted search a suitable tract of 36 acres in the Ashop Valley, near Ashop, was secured, with the co-operation of the Derwent Valley Water Board, on a 10 years' lease. The site, though steep, is well wooded, and a playing-field has been acquired by the river. A water supply has been laid on and it is intended to construct a bathing-pool early next Summer.

The Association are of the opinion that the funds at their disposal will enable them, if the work is done mainly by the Scouts, to make and equip a camping ground which in years to come will be one of the finest in the country.

It is intended to have a formal opening early next year. The Association desire to thank most heartily all those who have subscribed towards this fund.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1927.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held at the Channing Hall, the Lord Mayor, Alderman J. G. Graves in the Chair. The adoption of the Annual Report was moved by Alderman Graves and seconded by the Assistant District Commissioner for Bradford, S. M. Herries; the adoption of the Financial Statement was moved

by Mr. Albert Harland, M.P., and seconded by Mr. H. D. Sawtell. Lt.-Col. J. H. Leslie, D.L., spoke on "Scouting in the West Riding," and the Trophies and Diplomas were presented by Mr. Albert Harland.

WAKEFIELD RALLY, JUNE 16TH.

The chief scouting event of the year was the Scout Rally, at Wakefield, known as the "Wakefield Jellybree," when the Chief Scout on his visit to the West Riding was welcomed by some 12,000 Scouts and Cubs. At this "Jellybree" a new formation was tried for the first time, namely, "The Weal of Life," which, in spite of its being unrehearsed, was a great success, and impressed the Chief Scout and all who were present. The Sheffield Association sent 1,500 Scouts and Cubs to Wakefield, and were largely responsible for the formation and organising of the "Weal," thereby receiving the thanks of the County Commissioner for the part they had taken in making this rally a success.

SCOUTS' OWN.

On the following day, Sunday, June 17th, a "Scouts' Own" was held on the Doncaster Race Course, at which the Chief Scout and thousands of Scouts and Guides were present, and an impressive service was held by the Bishop of Sheffield.

SOUTHERN DIVISION SCOUT WEEK.

One of the chief events of the year was the holding of a Scout Week by the Southern Division during the week March 25th-31st. On March 25th a "Scouts' Own" was held in the Abbeydale Picture House; Mr. David Flather took the chair, and the Association Organiser, Mr. A. H. Muirhead, gave the address. During the week Parents' Evenings were held by the various Troops of the division. A Camp Fire Sing-song was held at the Aerodrome, Woodseats. On Friday and Saturday a Bazaar was held in the Meersbrook Vestry Hall, opened on the Friday by Mr. A. Harland, M.P.; Mr. J. Cook in the Chair; and on the Saturday by the Master and Mistress Cutler (Mr. and Mrs. P. Lee), Councillor Minshall in the Chair. The Bazaar was a great success, as indeed was the whole week.

JUMBLE SALE.

On April 21st, 1928, the Association held a Jumble Sale in the Engineers' Drill Hall, Glossop Road, by kind permission of the Commanding Officer, and Officers of the Royal Engineers. Those who were asked for contributions responded so generously that the Association was able to make a net profit of over £80.

OPENING OF THE TINSLEY PARK HUT ON MAY 12TH, 1928.

The starting of a new Group, the 171st Tinsley Park, was made possible by the generosity of Mr. and Mrs. Laverick and the Tinsley Park Colliery Co., who helped to provide headquarters for the group at School Hill, Tinsley. The Hut was christened "The King Arthur Hut," by Dr. Mary Andrews and opened by Mrs. Laverick, who is president of the Group. The Executive feel that in no way can the supporters of the Scout Movement help it better than by providing headquarters in which Groups can meet, and they wish to put on record their grateful thanks to Mr. and Mrs. Laverick, the Tinsley Park Colliery Co., and friends of the Troop, who have provided the Scouts with such a splendid headquarters.

CHURCH PARADES.

Two Church Parades have been held, the Armistice Day Parade being on Sunday, November 11th, and an innovation was made by holding it in the open air round the Cenotaph, some 3,000 Scouts and Cubs being present. The Rev. E. W. Selwyn conducted the service and a wreath was laid upon the Memorial.

The St. George's Day Parade was held on a week day and the attendance was naturally smaller. The Cubs attended service at St. James', conducted and addressed by the Rev. Dawson Parsons, and the Scouts at St. Paul's where the Archdeacon of Sheffield officiated.

EQUIPMENT DEPARTMENT.

The Equipment Department is steadily increasing its business at its new Headquarters in West Street and continues to render excellent service to the Troops which support it and the Association as a whole. The Executive desire once more to thank the Hon. Sec., Mr. Hale, for his great services, and also the Quarter-master, Mr. Revill, and his staff.

TRAINING TROOP PACK.

Both Summer and Winter Sessions have been well attended, and most new officers now make a practice of attending as many Training Troop Pack meetings as they can. Keen Scouters are finding that, in addition to the advantage of living for a time in an atmosphere of scoutlike brotherliness, their efficiency in leading their boys is increased by interchange of ideas, and by the variety of practices carried on in the Training Patrols and Sixes. Special events have been the Winter Re-union, the Easter Sing-song attended by some 700 Scouts and Cubs from the members' Groups,

the entertainment in the Easter holiday and the Re-union Camp, which was greatly enjoyed by a record number of campers.

The Troop has instituted the Training Troop and Pack First Class Certificate, for which an officer has to pass the First Class Tests just as the boys do. In the Pack, cubmasters are rapidly acquiring a great variety of games and stories, destined to add greatly to the joy and excitement which are so essential to good Cubbing. Both Troop and Pack have benefited by the lectures and demonstrations in First Aid so kindly given by Mr. R. Whitworth. The hearty thanks of the Association are due to Mr. Gaskin and Mr. Muirhead for their services as Scoutmaster and Cubmaster, respectively.

WOLF CUBS.

The Cub Rally took place on September 15th, and by the kindness of the headmaster of the King Edward VII School it was held in the School grounds.

A signalling game, and one of the Jungle Dances, comprised the competition for the Wolf Cub Shield which was won by the Southern Division. Sports were held, and a new departure was made by the acting of a little costume play. This was a great success, the dresses showing great ingenuity, and the 101st, St. George's, winning the prize for the best dressed pack. The Rally was opened by Mrs. J. C. Gow, the Chairman being Mr. T. W. Chapman.

A good number of Packs have camped during the year.

ROVERS.

Many more Rovers have been registered, and there is no longer a tendency for patrols or crews to remain independent of the local Rover organisation. There has been a gratifying amount of individual service, very largely in connection with Scouting. Possibly Rovering is partly responsible for the great increase in Scout Officers during the past year. In addition, however, to their individual service concerted efforts have been made in connection with the organising and taking charge of garden fetes, sales of work and similar events.

A scheme has been inaugurated whereby at short notice Rovers can take charge of Troops during the absence of the Scoutmaster. Representatives from Sheffield attended the Rover Moot at Whitsun.

A Competition necessitating the keeping of a log and requiring proficiency in such Scout qualities as camping, hiking, etc., has been held.

No Report would be complete without some mention being made of the work of Mr. W. Woollen, who has just resigned from his position as District Rover Leader of the Northern Division. The amount of intensive work he has carried out is amazing and his place will be very hard to fill.

"WOODSMOKE."

The Association magazine still continues to live up to its past reputation. Although the cost to the Association is a little more this year than last the manager, Mr. Chapman, hopes that the coming year will see the magazine put on a paying basis.

The Association wish to thank Dr. Mary Andrews, editor, and Mr. Chapman, business manager, for all the hard work they have done for the magazine, the continued success of which is entirely due to their energies.

MEMBERSHIP CARDS.

During the year the Local Association Membership Card for Scouts has undergone revision by the Badge Committee, and is now issued in a more compact form.

The old card was a four-fold cardboard sheet which continually needed renewing. The new issue is in book form with stiff linen covers, and contains much matter of interest which was absent in the old card. The details of Tenderfoot and Second Class Tests are given, and the Badges for Pathfinder and Bushman's Thong are grouped. The requirements for First Class Badge are given in full and provision is made for Progress Records and Badge Certificates.

It is intended that the new book shall gradually take the place of the old record.

HOW TO START A TROOP.

1. Read "Scouting for Boys" and "Aids to Scoutmastership," by the Chief Scout, in order to lay hold of the principles underlying the Scout Movement.

2. Read also "How to run a Troop," by Ernest Young, B.Sc., and "The Patrol System," by the Hon. Roland Phillips, both of which books give some very sound advice as of the running of a Troop.

3. Get a Club Room. Schools and Parish Halls are often available for use as Troop Headquarters. It is a good plan to get a room which the boys can call their very own, and which the Scouts themselves can take pride and pleasure in helping to fit up, etc.

4. Train half a dozen boys to be Patrol Leaders, say up to the stage of Second Class Scouts. By starting carefully and in a small way it will be found that after a few weeks there is the nucleus of a thoroughly sound Troop, which will expand on the right lines, and with much less trouble than if there had been more boys at first.

5. Admit applicants and form the Troop into Patrols of six or eight boys each.

6. Form a Troop Committee from amongst the boys' parents and others. This Committee would be responsible for the provision of suitable Headquarters, and for the management of Troop Finance.

7. Appoint an Assistant Scoutmaster to ensure the continuity of the Troop. Scoutmasters should ask those friends to join to whom they would like to entrust the Troop if they leave.

8. Immediately apply to the Secretary, Scout Office, Telephone Building, 10, West Street, Sheffield, for Registration Forms.

Arrangements will then be made for a member of the Executive Committee to visit and examine the Troop on a meeting night.

According to our rules, all Patrol Leaders should be well up in Tenderfoot work. If the visitor is satisfied, the Troop will be duly proposed for affiliation.

After election, an Affiliation Fee of Five Shillings and an Annual Subscription of Five Shillings must be paid.

The Affiliation Fee is paid to the Association, and the Annual Subscription is paid to the Division, through the Divisional Hon. Treasurer.

9. Each Troop in the Association has a neckerchief of distinctive colours. These colours must be settled in consultation with the Quartermaster to prevent duplication.

10. Read "The Scouter" regularly. Copies may be obtained through any Bookseller or from Local Headquarters, on the 15th of each month, price 3d.

COST OF RUNNING A TROOP.

1. Rent of Premises: This varies, but in the case of Troops attached to Schools or Churches the rent is usually nominal.

2. Cost of establishing a Troop: An affiliation fee of five shillings paid to the Local Association.

3. Working Expenses: Defrayed by a subscription of about one penny per week, contributed by each Scout.

4. Cost of Uniform: The Uniform, consisting of shorts, shirt, hat, scarf, belt and staff, can be obtained at a cost of about fifteen shillings.

5. Camp Gear: Much of this can be made at Troop Headquarters. Funds from a Troop Concert or Display are often devoted to the purchase of necessities.
