General Lord Baden-Powell's Scout Movement is one of the most popular and successful of all the organisations started to give boys a manly, courageous outlook on life. Backwoodsmen, frontiersmen, sea rovers, etc., are his heroes, and through woodcraft, nature study, and camping, he is led on to acquire their qualities of self-reliance and resource, bodily health and energy, technical skill and handicraft, and a sense of service to the community.

Endeavours have been made to frame rules on such broad lines as to embrace all classes and all creeds, while allowing the greatest possible independence to individual organisations, officers and boys.

Citizenship and character training are the foundation of all Scout work. One aim of the Boy Scout scheme is to revive amongst us, if possible, some of the rules of the knights of old, which did so much for the moral tone of our race. The object is not so much to discipline the boys as to teach them to discipline themselves.

TO DO MY DUTY TO GOD AND THE KING,

TO HELP OTHER PEOPLE AT ALL TIMES,

TO OBEY THE SCOUT LAW.

- (1) A Scout's honour is to be trusted.
- (2) A Scout is loval to the King, his country, his officers, his parents, his employers, and to those under him.
- (3) A Scout's duty is to be useful and to help others.
- (4) A Scout is a friend to all, and a brother to every other Scout, no matter to what social class the other belongs.
- (5) A Scout is courteous.
- (6) A Scout is a friend to animals.
- A Scout obeys orders of his parents, patrol leader, or Scoutmaster without question.
- (8) A Scout smiles and whistles under all difficulties.
- (9) A Scout is thrifty.
- (10) A Scout is clean in thought, word and deed.

THE

ANNUAL REPORT, 1928-29.

The Executive Committee present their Report for the year ending the 30th September, 1929. They are glad to report that the Membership of the Association shows an increase of 238, bringing the total to 4,483; the increase during the past three years is 986.

Troops number 85 as against 79 last year; Cub packs have increased from 65 to 71, and Rover Crews from 30 to 36. There are 19 more Officers than there were last year, but still more are urgently needed.

EVENTS OF THE YEAR.-INTERNATIONAL JAMBOREE.

The Great event of the year was the International Jamboree held at Birkenhead during the last week of July and the first week of August, to celebrate the 21st birthday of the Scout Movement. The Main Camp was pitched in Arrowe Park, but in order that as many scouts as possible should be able to attend on this occasion, the County Commissioner arranged an auxiliary West Riding Camp, on ground lent by Messrs. Lever Bros., at Thurstaston. In all, over 600 Scouts and Cubs from Sheffield attended this Camp for some part of the time, and a contingent of 50 were present in Arrowe Park for the whole fortnight.

The Sheffield Local Association volunteered to make itself responsible for the rationing of the West Riding Camp, and staffing and stocking all shops connected with the Camp, etc. This was carried out most successfully and the County Commissioner thanked the Sheffield Local Association, on behalf of the whole County, for the splendid way in which it had helped to make the West Riding Camp an undoubted success.

The Arrowe Park contingent also brought credit to the Association, their gateway was much admired; and the Hand Bell Ringers of the Western Division were in great request at all the Camp Fires during the Jamboree.

Mr. T. W. Chapman and the 11th Pitsmoor Group earned great praise for their novel and amusing Comic Skirkus, two performances of which were given in the stadium at Arrowe Park, and one at the West Riding Camp at Thurstaston. Altogether, we can say that Sheffield did its part to make the great 21st Jamboree an unrivalled success by sending large numbers of scouts and by putting in a great deal of hard work.

VISIT OF OVERSEAS SCOUTS.

Many private visits of overseas and foreign scouts to their brother scouts in Sheffield have been reported, and the Sheffield Association, through the kindness of many of their supporters, were enabled to entertain contingents from Australia, Germany, British Guiana, Jamaica and Esthonia. The proposed visit of the Nigerian Scouts was unfortunately cancelled through their having to leave England by an earlier boat than they had anticipated.

Every effort was made to make these visits of an educational value, to shew something of the great industries of our City and the life in English homes. It was particularly pleasing to have the Jamaica and British Guiana contingents, which numbered 51 in all, with us for a whole week.

The programme included a reception at the Town Hall by the Lord Mayor (Alderman H. Bolton), a luncheon given by the Master Cutler (Mr. T. G. Sorby), visits to Messrs. Vickers Ltd., The Tinsley Park Colliery Co. Ltd., Joseph Rodgers & Sons Ltd., Walker & Hall Ltd. and "The Sheffield Telegraph." An enjoyable evening was spent at a concert given by the Caledonian Society at the Oxford Picture House, and at the Speedway, Owlerton.

Receptions were given by Mr. M. A. Bedford and Mr. R. W. Girdwood.

The visit also included a visit to the Glossop Road Baths and an all day excursion by Motor 'Bus to the Caverns at Castleton.

Through the kind permission of the Parks Committee a Camp Fire was held in honour of our overseas visitors at Graves Park of the eve of their departure. This event was attended by many hundreds of the public and our visitors voiced their appreciation of the happy time they had spent in Sheffield.

The Association wish to thank all those who helped to make their visit so memorable.

ANNUAL MEETING, 1928.

The Annual Meeting of the Association was held on Friday, October 26th, in the Lower Montgomery Hall, the Lord Mayor, Ald. M. Humberstone, J.P., in the chain. A new feature of the Annual Meeting was the showing of scout films, of which there were two—"Tenderfoot Tim" and "Cubs Courageous"—and they were greatly appreciated by all present. The adoption of the Annual Report was moved by the Lord Mayor, and seconded by Mr. J. B. Cook. The Financial Statement was moved by Mr. A. Harland, and seconded by Mr. H. D. Sawtell.

The Association Trophies were presented by Mr. A. Harland, M.P.

AWARD FOR GALLANTRY.

The Chief Scout has awarded the Gilt Cross for Gallantry to Second Percy Justice, of the 147th St. Mary's, Walkley Group, for his courage in stopping a runaway horse on November 19th. The presentation of the Cross was made by the Chairman of the Association, Capt. W. Harland, in the Cathedral Yard after the St. George's Day Parade, in the presence of some 2,000 Scouts and Cubs.

The Association congratulates Second Justice on having his action recognised by the Chief Scout in this manner.

CAMPING.

Although the Scouts were naturally saving up for the great Jamboree there has been more camping than ever this year, the weather being largely responsible. Week-end camping at the Association Camping ground at Ashopton increased considerably, and although, owing to the arrangements for the Jamboree, a great deal of work has not been done upon the camp site itself, many groups are busy making group camp grounds.

During the year a Crew of Rovers was formed called the Grimbo Carr Crew, whose service is the making of the Camp site. It is hoped that work will go on apace now, so that a formal opening may take place next year. Up to the present the camp committee have been unable to find a hut of sufficiently large dimensions for the camp ground, at a price consistent with the funds at their disposal, but it is hoped to make an effort during the Winter to have a hut erected, so that work can proceed during the Spring before Canvas can be used.

The Western Division held their Annual Whitsuntide Camp at Derwent, and it was a great success.

CHURCH PARADES.

Two Annual Church Parades were held, one on St. George's Day, when the Cubs attended St. Paul's Church, where the Rev. Talbot Easter officiated, and the Scouts attended the Cathedral, where the Archdeacon preached.

The Armistice Day parade was held on Sunday, November 11th, the address being given by the Rev. P. M. Medcraft. In spite of the very bad weather there was a big muster and the parade was most impressive.

"WOODSMOKE."

The Association Magazine has continued to render great service to the Association, thanks to the untiring energy of its Editor and the business manager, Mr. Chapman. As a result of their hard work and skill "Woodsmoke" has, for the first time shown a profit, a very creditable achievement.

WOLF CUBS.

The number of Cubs has been increased by 81, making the total number in the Association 1601.

During the year the Cubmasters have formed themselves into a committee which meets regularly once a month. It consists of a chairman, secretary, treasurer, and the D.C.M. of each division or a representative appointed by him. The object is to draw up plans to improve cubbing locally. Once a quarter the meeting is thrown open to all Cubmasters and Assistants, thereby giving everyone an opportunity to voice their opinions.

The Cub Rally, held in July at the Farm Grounds, by kind permission of Her Grace the Duchess of Norfolk, was a great success. In the absence of the District Commissioner, Mr. A. Harland, the chair was taken by Col. Sir Charles Clifford and Mrs. Challenor (better known in the Cub world as Miss Nuttall, and before her marriage Cub Commissioner for Harrogate) very kindly came over from Hull to judge the competitions.

The Southern division won the shield for cub work, and the Sports events resulted in a tie between the Central and Western Divisions, so they will each have the Totem Pole for six months.

About 150 Sheffield Cubs attended the West Riding Camp at Thurstaston and took part in the Cub Rally at Arrowe Park.

THE ROVERS.

The Rover Commissioner, the Organiser, a Rover Leader and the Rover Secretary were present at the Rover Leaders' Moot in London in December. The new rules made as a direct result of this Conference found great favour in Sheffield Rovering circles; in spite of the criticism that the rules made entry into Rovering too difficult, almost a hundred new members have been accepted by the Rover Committee.

Keenness is greater than ever, and almost every new Rover has undergone the vigil and the full investiture ceremony.

A party from Sheffield attended the Midland Counties' Rover Moot at Derby.

Rovers were also of great assistance at the Jamboree at Soapever Camp and in Arrowe Park.

The Selwyn Trophy has again been competed for, points being awarded for a hike report, a log of the year's activities, and a Service Record.

The social side of Rovering has not been neglected, a dance having been held in December, 1928 and a social Hike in June, 1929.

EQUIPMENT DEPARTMENT.

Progress was continued in spite of a slight fall in turnover. A reduction in expenditure, however, prevented a corresponding fall in the net profit. It was hoped that the International Jamboree would increase the sale of Camp equipment, but expectations were not realised. The Association are once more grateful to Mr. Hale for his great assistance and to his willing and capable staff.

VISITS TO OTHER ASSOCIATIONS.

Many Members of the Associations have visited other Associations to attend Conferences and judge Competitions, and the Executive feel that this increased visiting between Associations must be of great benefit to the Scout movement. Several groups also have visited groups in other towns and have had groups to visit them.

RESIGNATIONS.

To the great regret of the Association, Mr. Gaskin has resigned the leadership of the Training Troop and Dr. Mary Andrews has given up the Editorship of "Woodsmoke." It is difficult to express adequately the debt which the Association owe to them both for their services. The Executive Committee are very glad to be able to report that the Rev. E. H. Rawlins, who has already done so much for scouting in Sheffield, has taken over the Training Troop, while the Rovers have volunteered to edit "Woodsmoke."

The Executive Committee learned with great regret of the death of Mr. J. C. Ward, Assistant County Commissioner for the West Riding. Mr. Ward had only just taken up his duties and the Executive feel that they have lost one who would have been a great friend and helper to the movement.

The Association extend their congratulations to their Hon. Treasurer, Mr. C. Lee Richards, on his being appointed a Justice of the Peace.

The Association wish to express their very grateful thanks to the Town Trustees for continuing their generous grant, which is all the more acceptable in view of the smallness of the subscription list. They also extend their thanks to their many supporters and to the Press.


